10	provide space for the applicant to voluntarily list any health
11	condition that may impede communication with a peace officer as
12	evidenced by:
13	(1) for a physical health condition, a written
14	statement from a licensed physician; or
15	(2) for a mental health condition, a written statement
16	from a licensed physician, a licensed psychologist, or a
17	non-physician mental health professional, as defined by Section
18	571.003, Health and Safety Code.
19	(b) The department shall provide to the Department of Public
20	Safety the vehicle registration information of a person who
21	voluntarily lists a health condition on an application under
22	Subsection (a).
23	(c) The Department of Public Safety shall establish a system
24	to include information received under Subsection (b) in the Texas

1	Law Enforcement Telecommunications System for the purpose of
2	alerting a peace officer who makes a traffic stop that the operator
3	of the stopped vehicle may have a health condition that may impede
4	communication.
5	(d) The department may not issue a license plate with a
6	visible marking that indicates to the general public that a person
7	voluntarily listed a health condition on an application under
, 8	Subsection (a).
9	(e) Information supplied to the department relating to an
9	(e) information supplied to the department relating to an
10	applicant's health condition is for the confidential use of the
11	department and the Department of Public Safety and may not be
12	disclosed to any person.
13	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
