A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to building standards for instructional facilities and
3	campus safety procedures for public schools.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 11, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 11.007 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 11.007. BUILDING STANDARDS FOR INSTRUCTIONAL
8	FACILITIES. (a) In this section, "instructional facility" has the
9	meaning assigned by Section 46.001.
10	(b) A school district that constructs a new instructional
11	facility must comply with the following building and design
12	standards:
13	(1) a lock on each entrance door to the building and
14	classroom door that enables the door to be locked and opened without
15	a key from inside the building or classroom;
16	(2) windows on classroom doors that are narrow and
17	placed on the side of the door away from the door handle;
18	(3) for a classroom or administrative office wall, the
19	use of material that is not glass or transparent;
20	(4) for each window in a classroom or administrative
21	office, a window covering that may be used to block the view;
22	(5) a fully functional public address system that can
23	be clearly heard from each classroom and hallway; and

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(6) an adequate number of security cameras to provide

- 1 video coverage of each building entrance and hallway.
- 2 SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 12, Education Code, is
- 3 amended by adding Section 12.138 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 12.138. BUILDING STANDARDS FOR INSTRUCTIONAL
- 5 FACILITIES. (a) In this section, "instructional facility" has the
- 6 meaning assigned by Section 46.001.
- 7 (b) An open-enrollment charter school that constructs a new
- 8 <u>instructional facility must comply with the following building and</u>
- 9 design standards:
- 10 (1) a lock on each entrance door to the building and
- 11 classroom door that enables the door to be locked and opened without
- 12 a key from inside the building or classroom;
- (2) windows on classroom doors that are narrow and
- 14 placed on the side of the door away from the door handle;
- 15 (3) for a classroom or administrative office wall, the
- 16 <u>use of material that is not glass or transparent;</u>
- 17 (4) for each window in a classroom or administrative
- 18 office, a window covering that may be used to block the view;
- 19 (5) a fully functional public address system that can
- 20 be clearly heard from each classroom and hallway; and
- 21 (6) an adequate number of security cameras to provide
- 22 video coverage of each building entrance and hallway.
- SECTION 3. Subchapter D, Chapter 37, Education Code, is
- 24 amended by adding Section 37.116 to read as follows:
- Sec. 37.116. CAMPUS SAFETY PROCEDURES. Each school
- 26 district and open-enrollment charter school shall adopt and
- 27 implement campus safety procedures that provide for the safety of

- 1 students and employees, including:
- 2 (1) ensuring the live video feed from each security
- 3 camera on a district or school campus is readily available to:
- 4 (A) the school district police department, if
- 5 applicable; or
- 6 (B) the dispatch center of a local law
- 7 enforcement agency responsible for responding to an emergency at a
- 8 campus of the district or school;
- 9 (2) requiring school activities to be conducted in a
- 10 classroom or in an area with direct access to a secure room, except
- 11 for athletic activities that may be held outdoors;
- 12 (3) testing the public address system regularly; and
- 13 (4) storing and maintaining in the main office of each
- 14 district or school campus an active shooter medical kit that
- 15 includes tourniquets, bandages, and other supplies that are
- 16 typically used to treat an injury involving traumatic blood loss.
- 17 SECTION 4. Subchapter C, Chapter 45, Education Code, is
- 18 amended by adding Section 45.0572 to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 45.0572. REQUIRED BUILDING STANDARDS. A school
- 20 district seeking the guarantee of eligible bonds to be used to fund
- 21 construction of a new instructional facility, as defined by Section
- 22 46.001, must comply with Section 11.007 in order to be eligible for
- 23 the guarantee.
- SECTION 5. Section 46.0081, Education Code, is amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- Sec. 46.0081. SECURITY CRITERIA IN DESIGN OF INSTRUCTIONAL
- 27 FACILITIES. (a) A school district that constructs a new

- 1 instructional facility or conducts a major renovation of an
- 2 existing instructional facility using funds allotted to the
- 3 district under this subchapter shall consider, in the design of the
- 4 instructional facility, appropriate security criteria.
- 5 (b) A school district that constructs a new instructional
- 6 facility using funds allotted to the district under this subchapter
- 7 must comply with Section 11.007.
- 8 SECTION 6. Subchapter B, Chapter 46, Education Code, is
- 9 amended by adding Section 46.0341 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 46.0341. REQUIRED BUILDING STANDARDS. Section
- 11 46.0081(b) applies to the payment of and application for assistance
- 12 under this subchapter.
- 13 SECTION 7. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 14 of this Act, each school district and open-enrollment charter
- 15 school shall adopt and implement campus safety procedures as
- 16 required by Section 37.116, Education Code, as added by this Act.
- SECTION 8. Sections 11.007 and 12.138, Education Code, as
- 18 added by this Act, apply only to the construction of a new
- 19 instructional facility that begins on or after September 1, 2019.
- 20 SECTION 9. Subchapter C, Chapter 45, Education Code, as
- 21 amended by this Act, and Chapter 46, Education Code, as amended by
- 22 this Act, apply only to a school district's application for
- 23 guarantee of bonds by the permanent school fund under Subchapter C,
- 24 Chapter 45, Education Code, or a school district's application for
- 25 state assistance under Chapter 46, Education Code, that is made on
- 26 or after September 1, 2019. A school district's application for
- 27 guarantee of bonds by the permanent school fund or for state

- 1 assistance under Chapter 46, Education Code, that is made before
- 2 September 1, 2019, is governed by the law in effect on the date the
- 3 application is made, and the former law is continued in effect for
- 4 that purpose.
- 5 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 6 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 7 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 8 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 9 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
