2	relating to the repeal of the low-income vehicle repair assistance,
3	retrofit, and accelerated vehicle retirement program and the use of
4	remaining funds.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 382.202, Health and Safety Code, is
7	amended by adding Subsection (q) to read as follows:
8	(q) A county may agree to contract with any appropriate
9	entity, including a metropolitan planning organization or a council
10	of governments, to implement a program under this section.
11	SECTION 2. Section 382.216, Health and Safety Code, is
12	amended to read as follows:

- 13 Sec. 382.216. INCENTIVES FOR VOLUNTARY PARTICIPATION IN
- 14 VEHICLE EMISSIONS INSPECTION AND MAINTENANCE PROGRAM. The
- 15 commission, the Texas Department of Transportation, and the Public
- 16 Safety Commission may, subject to federal limitations:
- 17 (1) encourage counties likely to exceed federal clean
- 18 air standards to implement voluntary[÷
- 19 $\left[\frac{\langle A \rangle}{}\right]$ motor vehicle emissions inspection and
- 20 maintenance programs[+ and
- 21 [(B) low-income vehicle repair assistance,
- 22 retrofit, and accelerated vehicle retirement programs];
- 23 (2) establish incentives for counties to voluntarily
- 24 implement motor vehicle emissions inspection and maintenance

- 1 programs [and low-income vehicle repair assistance, retrofit, and
- 2 accelerated vehicle retirement programs]; and
- 3 (3) designate a county that voluntarily implements a
- 4 motor vehicle emissions inspection and maintenance program [or a
- 5 low-income vehicle repair assistance, retrofit, and accelerated
- 6 vehicle retirement program] as a "Clean Air County" and give
- 7 preference to a county designated as a Clean Air County in any
- 8 federal or state clean air grant program.
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 382.220, Health and Safety Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 382.220. USE OF FUNDING FOR LOCAL INITIATIVE PROGRAMS
- 12 [PROJECTS]. (a) Money from fees collected under Section 382.202 or
- 13 382.302 may be [that is] made available to [participating] counties
- 14 [under Section 382.202(q) or 382.302 may be appropriated only] for
- 15 programs administered in accordance with Chapter 783, Government
- 16 Code, to improve air quality.
- 17 (a-1) A [participating] county may agree to contract with
- 18 any appropriate entity, including a metropolitan planning
- 19 organization or a council of governments, to implement a program
- 20 under Section $382.202\left[\frac{382.209}{7}\right]$ or this section.
- 21 (b) A program <u>authorized by</u> [under] this section must be
- 22 implemented in consultation with the commission.
- 23 <u>(c) A county that receives money under this section may use</u>
- 24 the money to fund [and may include] a program to:
- 25 (1) [expand and enhance the AirCheck Texas Repair and
- 26 Replacement Assistance Program;
- [(2) develop and implement programs or systems that]

- 1 remotely determine vehicle emissions and notify the vehicle's
- 2 operator;
- 3 (2) [(3) develop and implement projects to] implement
- 4 the commission's smoking vehicle program;
- 5 (3) [(4) develop and implement projects] in
- 6 consultation with the director of the Department of Public Safety,
- 7 <u>coordinate</u> [for coordinating] with local law enforcement officials
- 8 to reduce the use of counterfeit registration insignia and vehicle
- 9 inspection reports by providing local law enforcement officials
- 10 with funds to identify vehicles with counterfeit registration
- 11 insignia and vehicle inspection reports and to carry out
- 12 appropriate actions;
- 13 (4) [(5) develop and implement programs to] enhance
- 14 transportation system improvements, including improvements meant
- 15 to reduce congestion on existing roads, but not including toll
- 16 projects; or
- 17 (5) [(6) develop and] implement new air control
- 18 strategies designed to assist local areas in complying with state
- 19 and federal air quality rules and regulations.
- 20 (d) $[\frac{(c)}{(c)}]$ Money that is made available for the
- 21 implementation of a program under Subsection (c) [(b)] may not be
- 22 expended for local government fleet or vehicle acquisition or
- 23 replacement, call center management, application oversight,
- 24 invoice analysis, education, outreach, or advertising purposes.
- (e) $[\frac{d}{d}]$ Fees collected under Sections 382.202 and 382.302
- 26 may be used in an amount not to exceed \$7 million per fiscal year for
- 27 programs [projects] described by Subsection (c) [(b)], of which \$2

- 1 million may be used only for projects described by Subsection
- 2 (c)(3) [(b)(4)]. The remaining \$5 million may be used for any
- 3 program [project] described by Subsection (c) [(b)].
- 4 <u>(f)</u> The fees <u>described</u> by <u>Subsection (e)</u> shall be made
- 5 available only [to counties participating in the low-income vehicle
- 6 repair assistance, retrofit, and accelerated vehicle retirement
- 7 programs created under Section 382.209 and only] on a matching
- 8 basis, whereby the commission provides money to a county in the same
- 9 amount that the county dedicates to a project authorized by
- 10 Subsection $\underline{(c)}$ [$\frac{(b)}{(b)}$]. The commission may reduce the match
- 11 requirement for a county that proposes to develop and implement
- 12 independent test facility fraud detection programs, including the
- 13 use of remote sensing technology for coordinating with law
- 14 enforcement officials to detect, prevent, and prosecute the use of
- 15 counterfeit registration insignia and vehicle inspection reports.
- 16 (g) The commission shall distribute available money
- 17 collected under Section 382.202(e) that was designated for the
- 18 former low-income vehicle repair assistance, retrofit, and
- 19 accelerated vehicle retirement program to counties that
- 20 participated in that program. The commission shall distribute the
- 21 money in reasonable proportion to the amount of fees collected
- 22 under Section 382.202(e) in those counties or in the regions in
- 23 which those counties are located. A county that receives money
- 24 under this subsection may use the money only to fund a program
- 25 <u>authorized by this section. This subsection expires September 1,</u>
- 26 2023.
