A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to a study conducted by the Department of Public Safety on

- 3 the investigation and prosecution of sexual assault offenses.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 420, Government Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 420.016 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 420.016. STUDY AND REPORT REGARDING INVESTIGATION AND
- 8 PROSECUTION OF SEXUAL ASSAULT OFFENSES. (a) The department shall
- 9 conduct a study regarding the investigation and prosecution of
- 10 sexual assault offenses to determine the rate of case attrition for
- 11 those offenses and the reasons for the case attrition.
- 12 (b) In conducting the study, the department shall compile
- 13 information relating to the commission of offenses under Sections
- 14 22.011 and 22.021, Penal Code, including information regarding the
- 15 number of cases:

- 16 (1) in which the law enforcement agency investigating
- 17 the offense forwarded the case to the appropriate local county or
- 18 district attorney, including cases that are prosecuted as a
- 19 <u>different criminal offense;</u>
- 20 (2) closed or classified as inactive by the law
- 21 enforcement agency without forwarding the case to the appropriate
- 22 <u>local county or district attorney</u>, and the reasons for that closure
- 23 or classification;
- 24 (3) in which the local county or district attorney did

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- 1 not prosecute the offense, and the reasons for not prosecuting the
- 2 offense, including whether the offense was referred to a grand
- 3 jury; and
- 4 (4) dismissed after an indictment had been filed.
- 5 (c) The department shall identify the governmental entities
- 6 that possess information required by Subsection (b) and require
- 7 <u>each of those entities to report the information to the department</u>
- 8 in the manner prescribed by the department.
- 9 (d) Not later than December 1, 2020, the department shall
- 10 submit to the governor, the lieutenant governor, and each member of
- 11 the legislature and publish on the department's Internet website a
- 12 report on the results of the department's study under this section
- 13 and recommendations for legislative or other action.
- 14 (e) This section expires September 1, 2021.
- 15 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
