- 5 SECTION 1. Section 502.001(c), Business & Commerce Code, is

- 9 letters at least one-half inch high: "UNDER SECTION 32.51, PENAL
- 10 CODE, IT IS A STATE JAIL FELONY (PUNISHABLE BY CONFINEMENT IN A
- 11 STATE JAIL FOR NOT MORE THAN TWO YEARS) TO OBTAIN, POSSESS,
- 12 TRANSFER, OR USE A CUSTOMER'S DEBIT CARD OR CREDIT CARD NUMBER
- 13 WITHOUT THE CUSTOMER'S CONSENT OR EFFECTIVE CONSENT."
- SECTION 2. Section 32.51(b), Penal Code, is amended to read
- 15 as follows:
- 16 (b) A person commits an offense if the person, with the
- 17 intent to harm or defraud another, obtains, possesses, transfers,
- 18 or uses an item of:
- 19 (1) identifying information of another person without
- 20 the other person's consent or effective consent;
- 21 (2) information concerning a deceased natural person,
- 22 including a stillborn infant or fetus, that would be identifying

- 1 legal authorization; or
- 2 (3) identifying information of a child younger than 18
- 3 years of age.
- 4 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 5 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 6 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 7 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 8 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 9 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 10 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 11 before that date.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
