A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to clarifying and updating examination provisions for hearing instrument fitters and dispensers. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 402.104, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 Sec. 402.104. POWERS AND DUTIES REGARDING EXAMINATION. (a) The department shall develop and maintain an examination that may 8 9 include a written $\left[\frac{1}{r} - \frac{1}{r}\right]$ or practical tests. The department shall administer or arrange for the administration and validation 10 11 of the examination. 12 (b) [The examination shall be administered at least twice 13 each year. 14 [(c) The examination must be validated by an independent testing professional. 15 16 [(d)] The practical test [examination] must be administered by one or more qualified proctors selected and assigned by the 17 department. 18 (c) [(e)] The commission by rule shall establish 19 the 20 qualifications for a proctor. The rules must: 21 (1)require a proctor to be licensed in good standing 22 as a hearing instrument fitter and dispenser; 23 (2) specify the number of years a proctor must be licensed as a hearing instrument fitter and dispenser; and 24

(3) specify the disciplinary actions or other actions
2 that disqualify a person from serving as a proctor.

3 SECTION 2. Section 402.204(a), Occupations Code, is amended 4 to read as follows:

5 Sec. 402.204. CONTENTS OF EXAMINATION. (a) The 6 examination must consist of written <u>and</u> [, oral, or] practical 7 tests that are objective in method and applied in a consistent 8 manner.

9 SECTION 3. Section 402.205, Occupations Code, is amended to 10 read as follows:

Sec. 402.205. EXAMINATION PROCEDURES. (a) The department <u>or the department's designee</u> shall give each applicant due notice of the date and place of the examination and the subjects, areas, and skills that will be included in the examination. A change may not be made in those subjects, areas, and skills after the date of the examination has been announced and publicized.

17 (b) An examination shall be conducted in writing and by 18 other means the department determines adequate to ascertain the 19 qualifications of applicants.

20 (c) <u>An</u> [On reexamination, an] applicant who previously 21 failed <u>an examination or test</u> [an examination] may <u>retake the</u> 22 <u>examination or test.</u>

(d) An applicant who previously failed a practical test may
 24 <u>be retested</u> [be examined] only on those portions of the practical
 25 <u>test</u> [examination] that the applicant failed.

26 SECTION 4. Section 402.207(a), Occupations Code, is amended 27 to read as follows:

Sec. 402.207. ISSUANCE OF APPRENTICE PERMIT. (a) The
department shall issue an apprentice permit to fit and dispense
hearing instruments to a temporary training permit holder who has:
(1) passed the required [all parts of the] examination

5 [with a score of 70 percent or greater];
6 (2) paid the required fees; and

(3) met all requirements of this chapter.

8 SECTION 5. Section 402.209 (e) and (f), Occupations Code, 9 are amended to read as follows:

(e) If the department approves an application, [on the next regularly scheduled examination date] the applicant may take the practical <u>test</u> [section of the examination required under Section 402.202] and a written <u>test</u> [examination] of Texas law administered by the department <u>or its designee</u>. [If the applicant passes the examinations required under this section, the department shall issue to the applicant a license under this chapter.]

(f) The department may allow an applicant under this section who satisfies all application requirements other than the requirement under Subsection (c)(2) to take [all sections of] the examination [required under Section 402.202]. [If the applicant passes the examination, the department shall issue to the applicant a license under this chapter.]

23 SECTION 6. Section 402.203(c), Occupations Code, is 24 repealed.

25 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
