5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 511, Government Code, is amended by
7	adding Section 511.00906 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 511.00906. TRAINING PROGRAM REGARDING PREGNANT
9	PRISONERS. The commission shall adopt a training program for
10	county jailers that consists of education and training concerning
11	interacting with pregnant prisoners. The program must be based on
12	obstetrical and gynecological best practices and include general
13	<pre>information on:</pre>
14	(1) pregnancy, labor, delivery, and recovery;
15	(2) identifying when a woman is in labor;
16	(3) appropriate prenatal and postnatal care and first
17	aid techniques specific to pregnant women; and
18	(4) factors that increase the risk of a miscarriage.
19	SECTION 2. Section 1701.310(a), Occupations Code, is
20	amended to read as follows:
21	(a) Except as provided by Subsection (e), a person may not
22	be appointed as a county jailer, except on a temporary basis, unless
23	the person has satisfactorily completed a preparatory training

program, as required by the commission, in the operation of a county

- 1 jail at a school operated or licensed by the commission. The
- 2 training program must:
- 3 <u>(1)</u> consist of at least eight hours of mental health
- 4 training approved by the commission and the Commission on Jail
- 5 Standards; and
- 6 (2) include training concerning interacting with
- 7 pregnant women confined in jail based on the program adopted under
- 8 Section 511.00906, Government Code.
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 1701.352, Occupations Code, is amended
- 10 by adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:
- 11 (b-1) The commission shall require a county that appoints or
- 12 employs a county jailer to provide each jailer with the training
- 13 program adopted under Section 511.00906, Government Code, at least
- 14 once every 48 months. The training must be provided by a medical
- 15 professional.
- SECTION 4. Section 1701.310(a), Occupations Code, as
- 17 amended by this Act, applies only to a person appointed as a county
- 18 jailer on or after January 1, 2020. A person appointed as a county
- 19 jailer before January 1, 2020, is governed by the law in effect
- 20 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former
- 21 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 22 SECTION 5. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 23 of this Act:
- 24 (1) the Commission on Jail Standards shall adopt the
- 25 training program required by Section 511.00906, Government Code, as
- 26 added by this Act; and
- 27 (2) the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement shall

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- 1 adopt rules necessary to implement Section 1701.352(b-1),
- 2 Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- 3 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
