A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the expansion of the community mental health grant 3 program to include services to and treatment of individuals with 4 substance use disorders.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. The heading to Section 531.0999, Government
Code, as added by Chapter 770 (H.B. 13), Acts of the 85th

9 Sec. 531.0999. GRANT PROGRAM FOR MENTAL HEALTH <u>AND</u> 10 SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER SERVICES.

Legislature, Regular Session, 2017, is amended to read as follows:

SECTION 2. Section 531.0999, Government Code, as added by Chapter 770 (H.B. 13), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017, is amended by amending Subsections (a), (d), (f), (h), and (i) to read as follows:

15 (a) To the extent money is appropriated to the commission 16 for that purpose, the commission shall establish a matching grant 17 program for the purpose of supporting community mental health <u>and</u> 18 <u>substance use disorder programs providing services and treatment to</u> 19 individuals experiencing <u>a</u> mental illness <u>or substance use</u> 20 <u>disorder</u>.

(d) A grant awarded under the matching grant program and matching amounts must be used for the sole purpose of supporting community programs that provide mental health care <u>or substance use</u> disorder services and treatment to individuals with a mental

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1 illness <u>or substance use disorder, as applicable</u>, and that 2 coordinate mental health care <u>or substance use disorder</u> services 3 for individuals with a mental illness <u>or substance use disorder</u>, as 4 <u>applicable</u>, with other transition support services.

5 (f) A nonprofit or governmental entity that applies for a grant under this section must notify each local mental health 6 authority or local behavioral health authority with a local service 7 8 area that is covered wholly or partly by the entity's proposed community mental health or substance use disorder program and must 9 provide in the entity's application a letter of support from each 10 local mental health authority or local behavioral health authority 11 with a local service area that is covered wholly or partly by the 12 entity's proposed community mental health or substance use disorder 13 program. The commission shall consider a local mental health 14 15 authority's or local behavioral health authority's written input before awarding a grant under this section and may take any 16 17 recommendations made by the authority.

(h) A community that receives a grant under this section isrequired to leverage funds in an amount:

(1) equal to 50 percent of the grant amount if the community mental health <u>or substance use disorder</u> program is located in a county with a population of less than 250,000;

(2) equal to 100 percent of the grant amount if the
 community mental health <u>or substance use disorder</u> program is
 located in a county with a population of at least 250,000; and

(3) equal to the percentage of the grant amountotherwise required by this subsection for the largest county in

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which a community mental health <u>or substance use disorder</u> program is located if the community mental health <u>or substance use disorder</u> program is located in more than one county.

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4 (i) Except as provided by Subsection (j), from money 5 appropriated to the commission for each fiscal year to implement 6 this section, the commission shall reserve 50 percent of that total 7 to be awarded only as grants to a community mental health <u>or</u> 8 <u>substance use disorder</u> program located in a county with a 9 population not greater than 250,000.

10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
