A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to the licensing and regulation of massage therapy.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 455.059, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 455.059. INSPECTIONS; INVESTIGATIONS. (a) The
- 7 department, the department's authorized representative, or a peace
- 8 officer may enter the premises of a massage establishment or
- 9 massage school at:
- 10 (1) reasonable times to conduct an inspection
- 11 incidental to the issuance of a license; and
- 12 (2) other times that the department, the department's
- 13 authorized representative, or a peace officer considers necessary
- 14 to ensure compliance with this chapter and the rules adopted under
- 15 this chapter.
- 16 (b) During an inspection or investigation under Subsection
- 17 (a), a peace officer may require a massage therapist to provide the
- 18 therapist's fingerprints in the manner prescribed by commission
- 19 <u>rule.</u>
- 20 SECTION 2. Section 455.1525, Occupations Code, is amended
- 21 to read as follows:
- Sec. 455.1525. CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION
- 23 REQUIREMENT FOR LICENSE ISSUANCE [BACKGROUND CHECKS]. (a) The
- 24 department shall require an applicant for a license to submit a

- 1 complete and legible set of fingerprints, on a form prescribed by
- 2 the department, to the department or to the Department of Public
- 3 Safety for the purpose of obtaining criminal history record
- 4 information from the Department of Public Safety and the Federal
- 5 Bureau of Investigation [On receipt of an application for a license
- 6 under this chapter, the department shall conduct a criminal
- 7 background check on the applicant].
- 8 (b) The department may not issue a license to a person who
- 9 does not comply with the requirement of Subsection (a).
- 10 <u>(c) The department shall conduct a criminal history record</u>
- 11 information check of each applicant for a license using
- 12 information:
- 13 (1) provided by the individual under this section; and
- 14 (2) made available to the department by the Department
- 15 of Public Safety, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and any
- other criminal justice agency under Chapter 411, Government Code.
- 17 (d) The department may:
- 18 <u>(1) enter into an agreement with the Department of</u>
- 19 Public Safety to administer a criminal history record information
- 20 check required under this section; and
- 21 (2) authorize the Department of Public Safety to
- 22 <u>collect from each applicant the costs incurred by the Department of</u>
- 23 Public Safety in conducting the criminal history record information
- 24 check.
- (e) For purposes of this section, if the applicant for a
- 26 license is an entity, the applicant must submit fingerprints as
- 27 required by Subsection (a) for each individual who:

1	(1) personally or constructively holds, including as
2	the beneficiary of a trust:
3	(A) at least 10 percent of the entity's
4	outstanding stock; or
5	(B) more than \$25,000 of the fair market value of
6	the entity;
7	(2) has the controlling interest in the entity;
8	(3) has a direct or indirect participating interest
9	through shares, stock, or otherwise, regardless of whether voting
10	rights are included, of more than 10 percent of the profits,
11	proceeds, or capital gains of the entity;
12	(4) is a member of the board of directors or other
13	governing body of the entity; or
14	(5) serves as:
15	(A) an elected officer of the entity; or
16	(B) a general manager of the entity.
17	SECTION 3. Section 455.202, Occupations Code, is amended by
18	amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (e) to read as
19	follows:
20	(b) A massage establishment may not:
21	(1) employ an individual who is not a United States
22	citizen or a legal permanent resident with a valid work permit;
23	(2) employ a minor unless the minor's parent or legal
24	guardian authorizes in writing the minor's employment by the
25	establishment;
26	(3) allow a nude or partially nude employee to provide
27	massage therapy or other massage services to a customer;

- 1 (4) allow any individual, including a client, student,
- 2 license holder, or employee, to engage in sexual contact in the
- 3 massage establishment; [ex]
- 4 (5) allow any individual, including a student, license
- 5 holder, or employee, to practice massage therapy in the nude or in
- 6 clothing designed to arouse or gratify the sexual desire of any
- 7 individual; or
- 8 (6) allow any individual, including a student, license
- 9 holder, or employee, to reside on the premises of the massage
- 10 establishment.
- 11 (e) Subsection (b)(6) does not apply to:
- 12 (1) a place of business exempted under Section
- 13 455.155(c)(2) from the requirement to hold a license as a massage
- 14 establishment; or
- 15 (2) a licensed massage therapist who practices as a
- 16 solo practitioner and who is exempted under Section 455.155(b) from
- 17 the requirement to hold a license as a massage establishment.
- SECTION 4. Section 455.204, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 19 adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:
- 20 (b-1) The license of a massage therapist that is posted
- 21 under Subsection (b) must have attached to the front of the license
- 22 a photograph of the massage therapist.
- 23 SECTION 5. Subchapter E, Chapter 455, Occupations Code, is
- 24 amended by adding Section 455.207 to read as follows:
- Sec. 455.207. POSTING OF CERTAIN NOTICES REQUIRED. (a)
- 26 Each massage establishment and massage school shall display in the
- 27 form and manner prescribed by the commission a sign concerning

- 1 services and assistance available to victims of human trafficking.
- 2 (b) The sign required by this section must:
- 3 (1) be in English, Spanish, Korean, Mandarin, and any
- 4 other language required by commission rule;
- 5 (2) include a toll-free telephone number of a
- 6 nationally recognized information and referral hotline for victims
- 7 of human trafficking; and
- 8 (3) be displayed in a conspicuous place clearly
- 9 visible to the public.
- 10 <u>(c) The commission by rule shall establish requirements</u>
- 11 regarding the posting of signs under this section.
- 12 SECTION 6. Not later than January 1, 2020, the Texas
- 13 Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall adopt rules necessary
- 14 to implement the changes in law made by this Act to Chapter 455,
- 15 Occupations Code.
- SECTION 7. (a) Section 455.1525, Occupations Code, as
- 17 amended by this Act, applies only to an application for a license
- 18 submitted on or after the effective date of this Act. An
- 19 application for a license submitted before that date is governed by
- 20 the law in effect on the date the application was submitted, and the
- 21 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 22 (b) Not later than September 1, 2021, the Texas Department
- 23 of Licensing and Regulation shall obtain criminal history record
- 24 information on each person who, on the effective date of this Act,
- 25 holds a license issued under Chapter 455, Occupations Code, and did
- 26 not undergo a criminal history record information check based on
- 27 the license holder's fingerprints on initial application for the

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- 1 license. The department may suspend the license of a license holder
- 2 who does not provide the criminal history record information as
- 3 required by the department and this subsection.
- 4 SECTION 8. A massage establishment, as defined by Section
- 5 455.001, Occupations Code, shall comply with:
- 6 (1) Section 455.204(b-1), Occupations Code, as added
- 7 by this Act, not later than January 1, 2020; and
- 8 (2) Section 455.207, Occupations Code, as added by
- 9 this Act, not later than November 1, 2019.
- 10 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
