- 9 UNDER OTHER LAW. Notwithstanding any other law:
- 10 (1) on receipt of a complaint regarding a person who is
- 11 licensed, registered, or otherwise authorized to practice a
- 12 profession under this title, other than a physician or other person
- 13 licensed by the board, the board shall promptly forward a copy of
- 14 the complaint to the appropriate licensing agency; and
- 15 (2) the board may not take disciplinary action against
- 16 the person based on the complaint if the appropriate licensing
- 17 agency, after an investigation, takes disciplinary action against
- 18 the person or dismisses the complaint without taking disciplinary
- 19 <u>action</u>.

- 20 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 21 to a complaint filed on or after the effective date of this Act. A
