H.B. No. 2783

relating to the establishment of the Pediatric Acute-Onset
Neuropsychiatric Syndrome Advisory Council.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Subtitle E, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is
amended by adding Chapter 119A to read as follows:
CHAPTER 119A. PEDIATRIC ACUTE-ONSET NEUROPSYCHIATRIC SYNDROME
ADVISORY COUNCIL
Sec. 119A.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "advisory
council" means the Pediatric Acute-Onset Neuropsychiatric Syndrome
Advisory Council established under this chapter.
Sec. 119A.002. ESTABLISHMENT OF ADVISORY COUNCIL. The
Pediatric Acute-Onset Neuropsychiatric Syndrome Advisory Council
is established to advise the commission and the legislature on
research, diagnosis, treatment, and education related to pediatric
acute-onset neuropsychiatric syndrome.
Sec. 119A.003. APPOINTMENT OF ADVISORY COUNCIL MEMBERS.
(a) The advisory council is composed of the following 19 members:
(1) one member designated by the executive
<pre>commissioner;</pre>
(2) two members of the senate appointed by the
lieutenant governor;
(3) two members of the house of representatives
appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives; and

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(4) 14 members appointed by the governor with the 1 following qualifications: 2 3 (A) one member who is a licensed health care provider with expertise in treating persons with pediatric 4 acute-onset neuropsychiatric syndrome, including pediatric 5 autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated 6 with 7 streptococcal infections, and autism; (B) one member who is an osteopathic physician 8 with experience treating persons with pediatric acute-onset 9 10 neuropsychiatric syndrome, including pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal 11 12 infections; (C) one member who is a pediatrician with 13 experience treating persons with pediatric acute-onset 14 15 neuropsychiatric syndrome, including pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal 16 17 infections; (D) one member who is a child psychiatrist with 18 experience treating persons with pediatric acute-onset 19 neuropsychiatric syndrome, including pediatric autoimmune 20 neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal 21 22 infections; (E) one member who is an immunologist with 23 experience treating persons with pediatric acute-onset 24 neuropsychiatric syndrome, including pediatric autoimmune 25 26 neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal

infections, and the use of intravenous immunoglobulin;

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1	(F) one member who is a dietician or nutritionist
2	who provides services to children with autism spectrum disorders,
3	attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorders, and other
4	neuro-developmental conditions;
5	(G) one member with experience in conducting
6	research on pediatric acute-onset neuropsychiatric syndrome,
7	including pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders
8	associated with streptococcal infections, obsessive-compulsive
9	disorder, tic disorders, and other neurological disorders;
10	(H) one member who is licensed by this state to
11	<pre>practice as a social worker;</pre>
12	(I) one member who is a representative of the
13	Texas Education Agency with expertise in special education
14	services;
15	(J) one member who is a psychologist licensed
16	under Chapter 501, Occupations Code;
17	(K) one member who is a representative of a
18	professional organization in this state for school nurses;
19	(L) one member who is a representative of an
20	advocacy and support group in this state for individuals affected
21	by pediatric acute-onset neuropsychiatric syndrome, including
22	pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with
23	streptococcal infections;
24	(M) one member who is a representative of an
25	advocacy and support group in this state for individuals affected
26	by autism; and
27	(N) one member who is a parent of a child who has

- 1 been diagnosed with pediatric acute-onset neuropsychiatric
- 2 syndrome or autism.
- 3 (b) The member designated by the executive commissioner
- 4 serves as an ex officio nonvoting member. In the event of a tie vote
- 5 among the members of the advisory council, the member designated by
- 6 the executive commissioner may cast the deciding vote.
- 7 (c) Each member of the advisory council must be a citizen of
- 8 this state.
- 9 Sec. 119A.004. TERMS; VACANCY. (a) Advisory council
- 10 members appointed by the lieutenant governor and the speaker of the
- 11 house of representatives serve terms that coincide with the
- 12 advisory council members' terms of office. The remaining members
- 13 serve two-year terms.
- 14 (b) A vacancy on the advisory council shall be filled in the
- 15 same manner as the original appointment.
- 16 (c) A member appointed to fill a vacancy holds the office
- 17 for the unexpired portion of the term.
- 18 (d) Each member may be reappointed to serve on the advisory
- 19 council.
- Sec. 119A.005. CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR. Members of the
- 21 advisory council shall elect from among the legislative members of
- 22 the advisory council a chair and vice chair.
- Sec. 119A.006. MEETINGS; QUORUM. (a) The advisory council
- 24 shall meet at times and locations as determined by the chair or a
- 25 majority of the members of the advisory council.
- 26 (b) A majority of the members of the advisory council
- 27 constitute a quorum.

- Sec. 119A.007. ANNUAL REPORT. (a) Not later than September
- 2 1 of each year, the advisory council shall prepare and submit to the
- 3 governor, legislature, and commission a written report that
- 4 <u>includes recommendations on:</u>
- 5 (1) practice guidelines for the diagnosis and
- 6 treatment of pediatric acute-onset neuropsychiatric syndrome,
- 7 <u>including pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders</u>
- 8 associated with streptococcal infections;
- 9 (2) mechanisms to increase clinical awareness and
- 10 education regarding pediatric acute-onset neuropsychiatric
- 11 syndrome, including pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric
- 12 disorders associated with streptococcal infections, among
- 13 physicians, including pediatricians, school-based health centers,
- 14 and mental health care providers;
- 15 (3) strategies for outreach to educators and parents
- 16 to increase awareness of pediatric acute-onset neuropsychiatric
- 17 syndrome, including pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric
- 18 disorders associated with streptococcal infections; and
- 19 (4) developing a network of volunteer experts on the
- 20 diagnosis and treatment of pediatric acute-onset neuropsychiatric
- 21 syndrome, including pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric
- 22 disorders associated with streptococcal infections, to assist in
- 23 the delivery of education and outreach.
- (b) Notwithstanding any other law, this section, including
- 25 any action taken under this section to develop or disseminate
- 26 information or materials, does not create a civil or administrative
- 27 cause of action or a civil or criminal liability and does not create

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- 1 <u>a standard of care</u>, obligation, or duty that provides the basis for
- 2 a cause of action.
- 3 Sec. 119A.008. COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT. A member of
- 4 the advisory council is not entitled to compensation or
- 5 reimbursement for expenses incurred in performing advisory council
- 6 duties.
- 7 Sec. 119A.009. SUNSET PROVISION. The Pediatric Acute-Onset
- 8 Neuropsychiatric Syndrome Advisory Council is subject to Chapter
- 9 325, Government Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in
- 10 existence as provided by that chapter, the advisory council is
- 11 abo<u>lished and this chapter expires September 1, 2031.</u>
- 12 Sec. 119A.010. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER LAW. Chapter 2110,
- 13 Government Code, does not apply to the advisory council.
- 14 SECTION 2. Not later than December 31, 2019, the governor,
- 15 lieutenant governor, speaker of the house of representatives, and
- 16 executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission
- 17 shall appoint the members to the Pediatric Acute-Onset
- 18 Neuropsychiatric Syndrome Advisory Council as required by Section
- 19 119A.003, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.
- 20 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
