A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the reimbursement of certain urban teaching hospitals
- 3 for the provision of inpatient hospital care under Medicaid.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
- 6 is amended by adding Section 32.0285 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 32.0285. CALCULATION OF MEDICAL EDUCATION ADD-ON FOR
- 8 REIMBURSEMENT OF CERTAIN URBAN TEACHING HOSPITALS. (a) In this
- 9 section:
- 10 (1) "Base standard dollar amount" means the
- 11 standardized payment amount calculated by the commission for costs
- 12 incurred by prospectively paid hospitals in this state for
- 13 providing inpatient hospital care under Medicaid.
- 14 (2) "Children's hospital" means a hospital designated
- 15 by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services as a children's
- 16 hospital.
- 17 (3) "Medical education add-on" means an adjustment to
- 18 the base standard dollar amount for an urban teaching hospital to
- 19 reflect higher patient care costs relative to nonteaching urban
- 20 hospitals.
- 21 (4) "Rural hospital" means a hospital enrolled as a
- 22 Medicaid provider that:
- 23 (A) is located in a county with a population of
- 24 not more than 60,000;

1	(B) is designated by the Centers for Medicare and
2	Medicaid Services as a critical access hospital, sole community
3	hospital, or rural referral center and is not located in an area
4	defined by the United States Office of Management and Budget as a
5	metropolitan statistical area; or
6	(C) meets all of the following criteria:
7	(i) has 100 or fewer beds;
8	(ii) is designated by the Centers for
9	Medicare and Medicaid Services as a critical access hospital, sole
10	community hospital, or rural referral center; and
11	(iii) is located in an area defined by the
12	United States Office of Management and Budget as a metropolitan
13	statistical area.
14	(5) "State-owned teaching hospital" means:
15	(A) The University of Texas Medical Branch at
16	<pre>Galveston;</pre>
17	(B) The University of Texas Health Science Center
18	at Tyler; and
19	(C) The University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer
20	<pre>Center.</pre>
21	(6) "Teaching hospital" means a hospital that incurs
22	indirect costs for operating graduate medical education programs
23	and for which the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services has
24	calculated and assigned a percentage Medicare education adjustment
25	factor under 42 C.F.R. Section 412.105.
26	(7) "Urban hospital" means a hospital that:
27	(A) is located in an area defined by the United

- 1 States Office of Management and Budget as a metropolitan
- 2 statistical area; and
- 3 (B) is not a rural hospital, children's hospital,
- 4 state-owned teaching hospital, or freestanding psychiatric
- 5 facility.
- 6 (b) To the extent permitted by federal law, in order to
- 7 <u>ensure that urban teaching hospitals are accurately reimbursed for</u>
- 8 the provision of inpatient hospital care to recipients under
- 9 Medicaid, the commission shall at least annually update the
- 10 education adjustment factor used to calculate the medical education
- 11 add-on using the most current data available, including:
- 12 (1) data related to the number of interns and
- 13 residents enrolled in a hospital's approved teaching program; and
- 14 (2) the Medicare education adjustment factor assigned
- 15 under 42 C.F.R. Section 412.105 in effect at the time the commission
- 16 makes the update.
- 17 SECTION 2. (a) In this section:
- 18 (1) "Medicaid" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 19 531.001, Government Code.
- 20 (2) "Medical education add-on," "teaching hospital,"
- 21 and "urban hospital" have the meanings assigned by Section 32.0285,
- 22 Human Resources Code, as added by this Act.
- 23 (b) As soon as practicable after the effective date of this
- 24 Act, the Health and Human Services Commission shall conduct a study
- 25 to evaluate the impacts and effectiveness of using the Medicare
- 26 education adjustment factor assigned under 42 C.F.R. Section
- 27 412.105 in effect on the effective date of this Act to calculate the

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- 1 medical education add-on used to reimburse teaching hospitals for
- 2 the provision of inpatient hospital care under Medicaid. The
- 3 commission shall develop and make recommendations on alternative
- 4 factors and methodologies for calculating and annually updating the
- 5 medical education add-on that:
- 6 (1) best recognize the higher costs incurred by 7 teaching hospitals; and
- 8 (2) mitigate issues identified with using the Medicare
- 9 education adjustment factor without reducing reimbursements to
- 10 urban teaching hospitals that have maintained or increased the
- 11 number of interns and residents enrolled in the hospitals' approved
- 12 teaching programs.
- 13 (c) Not later than December 1, 2020, the Health and Human
- 14 Services Commission shall report its findings and recommendations
- 15 under Subsection (b) of this section to the governor, the standing
- 16 committees of the senate and house of representatives having
- 17 primary jurisdiction over matters relating to state finance and
- 18 appropriations from the state treasury, the standing committees of
- 19 the senate and house of representatives having primary jurisdiction
- 20 over Medicaid, and the Legislative Budget Board.
- 21 SECTION 3. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 22 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 23 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 24 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 25 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 26 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 27 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
