4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 201.905(b), Transportation Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	(b) A program under this section may also include literature
8	distributed to the public by the department concerning:
9	(1) the program established under this section; and
10	(2) highway safety corridors designated under Section
11	<u>201.9051</u> .
12	SECTION 2. Subchapter K, Chapter 201, Transportation Code,
13	is amended by adding Section 201.9051 to read as follows:
14	Sec. 201.9051. HIGHWAY SAFETY CORRIDOR. (a) The
15	department may designate as a highway safety corridor a portion of a
16	roadway containing:
17	(1) a site described by Section 201.905; or
18	(2) any other site with a high number of traffic
19	fatalities, as identified by the department.
20	(b) The department shall erect a sign at each end of the
21	highway safety corridor and at appropriate intermediate sites along
22	the corridor:
23	(1) indicating that it is a highway safety corridor;
24	and

- 1 (2) stating "Fines double: highway safety corridor."
- 2 <u>(c) The department may include on the same sign the</u>
- 3 information required for:
- 4 (1) a highway safety corridor under this section; and
- 5 (2) a traffic safety sign under Section 201.905(a).
- 6 (d) The commission by rule shall establish a process to
- 7 <u>identify sites with high numbers of traffic fatalities.</u>
- 8 SECTION 3. Subchapter D, Chapter 542, Transportation Code,
- 9 is amended by adding Section 542.4046 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 542.4046. FINE FOR OFFENSE IN HIGHWAY SAFETY CORRIDOR.
- 11 (a) In this section, "highway safety corridor" means a portion of a
- 12 roadway designated by the department in accordance with Section
- 13 201.9051.
- 14 (b) If an offense under this subtitle, other than an offense
- under Chapter 548 or 552 or Section 545.412 or 545.413, is committed
- 16 <u>in a highway safety corridor:</u>
- 17 (1) the minimum fine applicable to the offense is
- 18 twice the minimum fine that would be applicable to the offense if it
- 19 were committed outside a highway safety corridor; and
- 20 (2) the maximum fine applicable to the offense is
- 21 twice the maximum fine that would be applicable to the offense if it
- 22 were committed outside a highway safety corridor.
- 23 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 24 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 25 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 26 covered by the law in effect immediately before the effective date
- 27 of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that

- 1 purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed
- 2 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense
- 3 was committed before that date.
- 4 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
