SECTION 7. The change in law made by this Act applies only 11 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. 12 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is 13 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed, 14 15 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the 16 17 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred before that date. 18
