A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the appointment of special commissioners to assess damages in an eminent domain proceeding. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 21.014(a), Property Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 (a) The judge of a court in which a condemnation petition is filed or to which an eminent domain case is assigned shall appoint, 8 9 not later than the third day after the date the condemnation petition is filed, three disinterested real property owners who 10 reside in the county as special commissioners to assess the damages 11 of the owner of the property being condemned. The judge appointing 12 the special commissioners shall give preference to persons agreed 13 14 on by the parties. The judge shall provide the owner of the property being condemned and the condemnor [each party] a 15 16 reasonable period not to exceed 20 days after the date of the 17 appointment to strike one of the three commissioners appointed by the judge. If a person fails to serve as a commissioner or is struck 18 by a party to the suit, the judge shall appoint a replacement not 19 later than the third day after the date the judge receives notice 20 21 that the appointee will not serve or is struck.

22 SECTION 2. Section 21.014, Property Code, as amended by 23 this Act, applies only to a condemnation proceeding in which the 24 petition is filed on or after the effective date of this Act. A

1 condemnation proceeding filed before the effective date of this Act 2 is governed by the law as it existed immediately before the 3 effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for 4 that purpose.

5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
