- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subtitle H, Title 2, Education Code, is amended 6 by adding Chapter 39B to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 39B. RESOURCE CAMPUS
- 8 SUBCHAPTER A. DESIGNATION AS RESOURCE CAMPUS
- 9 Sec. 39B.001. RESOURCE CAMPUS. (a) A school district
- 10 campus that is eligible under Subsection (b) may apply to the
- 11 commissioner to be designated as a resource campus that provides
- 12 quality education and enrichment for campus students.
- 13 (b) To apply to be designated as a resource campus under
- 14 this chapter the campus must have received an overall performance
- 15 rating under Section 39.054 of F for two consecutive years or D for
- 16 three consecutive years.
- 17 (c) A campus approved by the commissioner as a resource
- 18 <u>campus under this chapter:</u>
- 19 <u>(1) is exempt from the interventions and sanctions</u>
- 20 provided by Chapter 39A; and
- 21 (2) qualifies for funding as provided by Section
- 22 42.2511.

- Sec. 39B.002. CAMPUS EVALUATION TEAM AND NEEDS ASSESSMENT.
- 24 Before a campus submits to the commissioner an application to be

| 23 | Sec. 39B.003. PUBLIC MEETING. Before a campus submits an |
| 24 | application to be designated as a resource campus, the campus must |
| 25 | conduct a public meeting to review the campus overall performance |
| 26 | rating and solicit input for the development of the targeted |
| 27 | improvement plan required under Section 39A.055. The meeting must |

- 1 include participation by:
- 2 (1) the principal;
- 3 (2) members of the campus-level planning and
- 4 decision-making committee established under Section 11.251;
- 5 (3) parents of students attending the campus; and
- 6 (4) community members who reside in the school
- 7 district.
- 8 Sec. 39B.004. RECOMMENDATION OF CAMPUS EVALUATION TEAM.
- 9 The campus evaluation team shall:
- 10 (1) determine if the campus would benefit from
- 11 designation as a resource campus; and
- 12 (2) provide recommendations on policies the campus
- 13 must adopt to meet the resource campus program requirements.
- 14 Sec. 39B.005. DECISION OF COMMISSIONER. (a) The
- 15 commissioner shall notify a campus if it has been designated as a
- 16 resource campus not later than the 60th day after the date the
- 17 commissioner receives the request for the designation.
- 18 (b) To allow a resource campus an opportunity to prepare to
- 19 operate as provided by this chapter, including the hiring and
- 20 training of educators, the campus begins the school year as a
- 21 resource campus as provided by this chapter during the second
- 22 school year that begins after approval of the designation by the
- 23 commissioner.
- (c) A decision by the commissioner regarding whether to
- 25 <u>designate a campus as a resource campus is final and may not be</u>
- 26 appealed.

| 2 | Sec. 39B.051. PRINCIPAL. (a) The principal of a resource |
| 3 | campus must demonstrate effectiveness in working with high-need |
| 4 | campuses. |
| 5 | (b) The person who was principal of the campus before the |
| 6 | campus was designated as a resource campus may apply to continue as |
| 7 | principal of the resource campus if the person has the minimum |
| 8 | experience required by Subsection (c)(1). |
| 9 | (c) A principal of a resource campus must: |
| 10 | (1) have at least three years of experience as an |
| 11 | administrator; |
| 12 | (2) demonstrate a history of: |
| 13 | (A) developing a plan for campus improvement; and |
| 14 | (B) consistently and proactively facilitating |

| 22 | (1) establish protocols to ensure achievement of |
| 23 | campus goals and targets and continuously analyze any available |
| 24 | data to monitor, evaluate, and refine the goals and targets; |
| 25 | (2) develop collective instructional practices that |
| 26 | are consistent with child development, effective pedagogy, and the |
| 27 | needs of each student; |

- 1 (3) implement and oversee a system of monitoring
 2 research-based instructional strategies in every classroom;
- (4) provide educators at the campus with timely,
- 4 relevant, and constructive feedback;
- 5 (5) provide multiple sources of progress monitoring
- 6 for teachers to ensure that students are consistently improving;
- 7 (6) collaborate with all campus educators and use
- 8 multiple measures and data from multiple points of the school year
- 9 to complete accurate appraisals of all educators, including
- 10 evidence from observations and formal and informal interactions;
- 11 (7) set specific goals for each educator at the campus
- 12 and actively track the educator's progress;
- 13 (8) use all campus funds in compliance with state and
- 14 federal guidelines and maximize the goals of the campus; and
- 15 (9) implement effective strategies to systematically
- 16 gather input and communication from all campus and community
- 17 stakeholders to ensure that all are an integral part of the campus

- 19 Sec. 39B.052. TEACHERS. (a) A teacher at a resource campus
- 20 must have at least three years of teaching experience. The
- 21 principal, after consultation with district administration, has
- 22 sole discretion over the hiring of teachers.
- (b) After a campus receives designation as a resource
- 24 campus, every teacher employed at the campus before the designation
- 25 must apply for a position to continue as a teacher at the campus.
- 26 (c) All rights and protections afforded by current
- 27 employment contracts or agreements are not affected by the resource

| 14 | must employ at least one school counselor for every 300 students. |
| 15 | (b) The school counselor shall implement a positive |

| 17 | Sec. 39B.054. SOCIAL SERVICES PROFESSIONAL. A resource |
| 18 | campus must employ at least one appropriately licensed professional |
| 19 | to assist with the social and emotional needs of students and staff. |

| 22 | (2) clinical social worker; |

| 25 | SUBCHAPTER C. OPERATION OF CAMPUS |
| 26 | Sec. 39B.101. EXEMPTION FROM ACCOUNTABILITY INTERVENTIONS |
| 27 | AND SANCTIONS. The commissioner may not impose a sanction or take |

- 1 action against a resource campus under Section 39A.111 for failure
- 2 to satisfy academic performance standards during the first two
- 3 school years of operation as a resource campus. The overall
- 4 performance rating received by the campus during the first two
- 5 school years of operation as a resource campus is not included in
- 6 calculating consecutive school years and is not considered a break
- 7 in consecutive school years under Section 39A.111.
- 8 <u>Sec. 39B.102. ANNUAL APPRAISAL. (a) All educators,</u>
- 9 including the principal, must be evaluated on an annual basis by an
- 10 appropriate supervisor.
- 11 (b) In a manner consistent with Chapter 21, the principal
- 12 may remove an educator if the educator falls below an accomplished
- 13 rating in one or more categories.
- 14 Sec. 39B.103. LOCAL EVALUATION SYSTEM. (a) If a resource
- 15 campus does not use a state evaluation program, the campus must
- 16 develop an appraisal system that is supported by locally adopted
- 17 policy and procedures and complies with Section 21.352.
- 18 (b) The district-level planning and decision-making
- 19 committee established under Section 11.251 shall develop an
- 20 appraisal process and evaluation criteria for all educators,
- 21 <u>including discipline management and the performance of an</u>
- 22 educator's students.
- 23 <u>(c) The appraisal process must include:</u>
- 24 (1) a conference between the educator and the
- 25 appraiser that is diagnostic and prescriptive with regard to
- 26 remediation needed in overall performance by category; and
- 27 (2) criteria based on observable, job-related

- 1 behavior, including:
- 2 (A) the educator's implementation of classroom
- 3 management procedures; and
- 4 (B) the performance of any students assigned to
- 5 the educator.
- 6 (d) The district-level planning and decision-making
- 7 committee shall submit the appraisal process and criteria to the
- 8 superintendent, who shall submit the appraisal process and criteria
- 9 to the board of trustees of the district with a recommendation to
- 10 accept or reject.
- 11 (e) The board of trustees may accept or reject an appraisal
- 12 process and performance criteria, with comments, but may not modify
- 13 the process or criteria.
- 14 Sec. 39B.104. CAMPUS SALARIES; SCHOOL DAY; CLASS SIZE. (a)
- 15 Educators at a resource campus must receive a salary higher than the
- 16 district average.
- 17 (b) The school day at a resource campus must be longer than
- 18 the school day at a similar campus in the district that is not
- 19 designated as a resource campus.
- 20 <u>(c) Class size at a resource campus may not exceed one</u>
- 21 <u>teacher for every 22 students.</u>
- 22 (d) Every classroom at a resource campus must have advanced
- 23 technology programs and applications.
- Sec. 39B.105. USE OF ADDITIONAL FUNDING. (a) A portion of
- 25 any additional funding received by the school district under
- 26 Section 42.2511 and attributable to the resource campus must be
- 27 used to provide higher salaries for all educators at the resource

- 1 campus as required by Section 39B.104(a). The district shall make
- 2 every effort to provide each educator with a significant salary
- 3 increase. The increased salary provided under this subchapter is a
- 4 supplement to the educator's salary and may not supplant any other
- 5 increase for which the educator is eligible.
- 6 (b) A portion of any additional funding received by the
- 7 school district under Section 42.2511 and attributable to the
- 8 resource campus:
- 9 (1) must be used to provide additional technology in
- 10 every classroom at the resource campus; and
- 11 (2) may be used for any needed resource campus
- 12 facility improvements.
- 13 <u>SUBCHAPTER D. RULES</u>
- Sec. 39B.151. COMMISSIONER RULES. The commissioner may
- 15 adopt rules necessary to implement this chapter.
- SECTION 2. Section 42.2511(a), Education Code, is amended
- 17 to read as follows:
- 18 (a) This section applies only to:
- 19 (1) a school district and an open-enrollment charter
- 20 school that enter into a contract to operate a district campus as
- 21 provided by Section 11.174; [and]
- 22 (2) a charter granted by a school district for a
- 23 program operated by an entity that has entered into a contract under
- 24 Section 11.174, provided that the district does not appoint a
- 25 majority of the governing body of the charter holder; and
- 26 (3) a school district that operates a resource campus
- 27 as provided by Chapter 39B.

- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 5 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
