H.B. No. 2883

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to training requirements and prohibited discrimination 3 for child-care facilities and registered family homes. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 42.042(e), Human Resources Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 (e) The executive commissioner shall promulgate minimum 7 standards that apply to licensed child-care facilities and to 8 registered family homes covered by this chapter and that will: 9 promote the health, safety, and welfare 10 (1) of 11 children attending a facility or registered family home; 12 (2) promote safe, comfortable, and healthy physical 13 facilities and registered family homes for children; 14 (3) ensure adequate supervision of children by capable, qualified, and healthy personnel; 15 ensure adequate and healthy food service where 16 (4) food service is offered; 17 18 (5) prohibit [racial] discrimination based on race or disability by child-care facilities and registered family homes; 19 (6) require procedures for parental and guardian 20 21 consultation in the formulation of children's educational and therapeutic programs; 22 23 (7) prevent the breakdown of foster care and adoptive 24 placement; and

No. 2883 1 (8) ensure that a child-care facility or registered 2 family home: follows the directions of a child's physician 3 (A) or other health care provider in providing specialized medical 4 5 assistance required by the child; and 6 (B) maintains for a reasonable time a copy of any 7 directions from the physician or provider that the parent provides 8 to the facility or home. SECTION 2. Section 42.0421, Human Resources Code, 9 is amended by adding Subsections (a-1) and (a-2) to read as follows: 10 (a-1) The initial training described by Subsection (a)(1) 11 12 must include training on: (1) trauma-informed care; and 13 14 (2) behavioral health that includes: 15 (A) methods for: 16 (i) understanding and managing behaviors; 17 (ii) requesting a consultation; and (iii) providing support to all children who 18 19 are provided care; and 20 (B) a description of the impact autism and other 21 intellectual and developmental disabilities have on behavior and 22 communication. (a-2) The annual training described by Subsection (a)(2) 23 24 must include training on providing care to children with special needs that includes methods for: 25 26 identifying possible developmental delays; 27 (2) locating community resources for the children;

1 (3) providing effective communication to the 2 children's parents; and 3 (4) accommodating the special needs of children in the 4 classroom. 5 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human 6 7 Services Commission shall adopt the rules necessary to implement 8 the changes in law made by this Act.

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
