- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1A, Chapter 397, Acts of the 68th
- 6 Legislature, Regular Session, 1983, as added by Chapter 498, Acts
- 7 of the 81st Legislature, Regular Session, 2009, is amended to read
- 8 as follows:
- 9 Sec. 1A. COMPOSITION OF PORT COMMISSION. The port
- 10 commission is composed of seven port commissioners [members].
- SECTION 2. Section 2(a), Chapter 397, Acts of the 68th
- 12 Legislature, Regular Session, 1983, is amended to read as follows:
- 13 (a) Port commissioners are appointed as follows:
- 14 (1) the commissioners court [The Commissioners Court]
- 15 of Nueces County shall appoint two port commissioners;
- 16 (2) the city council of the City of Corpus Christi
- 17 shall appoint three port commissioners; and
- 18 (3) the commissioners court of San Patricio County
- 19 shall appoint two port commissioners [four members to the port
- 20 commission, and the City Council of Corpus Christi shall appoint
- 21 three members to the port commission].
- SECTION 3. Sections 1, 2, 3, and 4, Chapter 1334, Acts of
- 23 the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003, are repealed.
- SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act does not

- 1 affect the term of a port commissioner of the port commission of the
- 2 Port of Corpus Christi Authority of Nueces County, Texas, serving
- 3 on the effective date of this Act. Port commissioners appointed to
- 4 fill vacancies occurring on or after the effective date of this Act
- 5 must be appointed in accordance with Section 2(a), Chapter 397,
- 6 Acts of the 68th Legislature, Regular Session, 1983, as amended by
- 7 this Act.
- 8 SECTION 5. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails
- 9 over another Act of the 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019,
- 10 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted
- 11 codes.
- 12 SECTION 6. (a) The legal notice of the intention to
- 13 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this
- 14 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a
- 15 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies,
- 16 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished
- 17 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313,
- 18 Government Code.
- 19 (b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has
- 20 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on
- 21 Environmental Quality.
- (c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed
- 23 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the
- 24 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
- 25 representatives within the required time.
- 26 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this
- 27 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect

- 1 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled
- 2 and accomplished.
- 3 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
