- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 565, Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 565.0591 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 565.0591. REVOCATION OF PHARMACY LICENSE FOR FAILURE
- 8 TO OPERATE. (a) On discovery by the board that a pharmacy licensed
- 9 under Chapter 560 has ceased to operate for a period of 30 days or
- 10 longer, the board shall notify the pharmacy that the license will be
- 11 revoked.
- 12 (b) The notice must:
- 13 (1) include a statement that the pharmacy license is
- 14 being revoked for violation of Section 565.002(a)(7); and
- 15 (2) inform the license holder of the license holder's
- 16 right to a hearing to contest the revocation.
- 17 (c) Not later than the 20th day after the date the license
- 18 holder receives the notice of revocation under this section, the
- 19 <u>license holder may submit a written request for a hearing to contest</u>
- 20 the revocation.
- 21 (d) If the license holder does not request a hearing within

- 1 (e) If the license holder requests a hearing within the

- 4 At the hearing the panel shall determine whether the license holder

- 6 (f) If the panel determines that the license holder
- 7 committed the violation, the board shall promptly:
- 8 <u>(1) enter an order revoking the license; and</u>
- 9 (2) notify the license holder of the order.
- (g) Chapter 2001, Government Code, does not apply to a
