8	AGENCIES AND OTHER ENTITIES. (a) <u>The following entities</u> [Criminal
9	justice agencies, the Legislative Budget Board, and the council]
10	are entitled to access the databases of the Department of Public
11	Safety, the Texas Juvenile Justice Department, and the Texas
12	Department of Criminal Justice in accordance with applicable state
13	or federal law or regulations <u>:</u>
14	(1) criminal justice agencies;
15	(2) the Legislative Budget Board;
16	(3) the council; and
17	(4) an individual or an agency that has a specific
18	agreement with a criminal justice agency to provide services
19	required for the administration of criminal justice under that
20	agreement, if the agreement:
21	(A) specifically authorizes access to
22	information;
23	(B) limits the use of information to the purposes
24	for which it is given;

1	(C) ensures the security and confidentiality of
2	the information;
3	(D) provides for sanctions if a requirement
4	imposed under Paragraph (A), (B), or (C) is violated; and
5	(E) requires the individual or agency to perform
6	the applicable services in a manner prescribed by the Department of
7	Public Safety.
8	(b) The access granted by this article does not entitle <u>an</u>
9	entity authorized to access information under Subsection (a) [a
10	criminal justice agency, the Legislative Budget Board, or the
11	council] to add, delete, or alter data maintained by another entity
12	[agency].
13	SECTION 2. Article 66.203, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Art. 66.203. PUBLIC DISCLOSURE OF DATA PROHIBITED. <u>An</u>
16	entity authorized to access information under Article 66.201(a) [A
17	criminal justice agency, the council, and the Legislative Budget
18	Board] may not disclose to the public information in an
19	individual's criminal history record if the record is protected by
20	state or federal law or regulation.
21	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
