- 9 (1) a trailer, semitrailer, pole trailer, or mobile

- 12 (2) a vehicle moving under or bearing a paper dealer
- 13 in-transit tag, machinery license, disaster license, parade
- 14 license, prorate tab, one-trip permit, vehicle temporary transit
- 15 permit, antique license, custom vehicle license, street rod
- 16 license, temporary 24-hour permit, or permit license;
- 17 (3) a trailer, semitrailer, pole trailer, or mobile
- 18 home having an actual gross weight or registered gross weight of
- 19 7,500 pounds or less;
- 20 (4) farm machinery, road-building equipment, a farm
- 21 trailer, or a vehicle required to display a slow-moving-vehicle
- 22 emblem under Section 547.703;
- 23 (5) a former military vehicle, as defined by Section

- 1 (6) a vehicle qualified for a tax exemption under

- 5 (b) The vehicle safety inspection requirements of this
- 6 chapter do not apply to an authorized emergency vehicle.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 548.510(a), Transportation Code, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 (a) A vehicle described by Section <u>548.052(a)(3)</u>
- 10 $[\frac{548.052(3)}{}]$ that has an actual gross weight or registered gross
- 11 weight of more than 4,500 pounds is subject to a fee in the amount of
- 12 \$7.50.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
