4	SECTION 1. Section 205.001, Occupations Code, is amended by
5	amending Subdivisions (2) and (4) and adding Subdivision (2-a) to
6	read as follows:
7	(2) "Acupuncture" means:
8	(A) the nonsurgical, <u>incisive</u> [nonincisive]
9	insertion of an acupuncture needle and the application of
10	moxibustion to specific areas of the human body as a primary mode of
11	therapy to treat and mitigate a human condition, including
12	evaluation and assessment of the condition; and
13	(B) in conjunction with the treatment described
14	by Paragraph (A):
15	(i) the administration of thermal or
16	electrical treatments [or the recommendation of dietary
17	guidelines], energy flow exercise, or dietary or herbal
18	supplements; or
19	(ii) the recommendation of dietary
20	guidelines [in conjunction with the treatment described by
21	Paragraph (A)].
22	(2-a) "Acupuncture needle" means a device described by
23	21 C.F.R. Section 880.5580, as that section existed on January 1,
24	2019.

- 2 (A) holds a license to practice [practices]
- 3 acupuncture <u>issued under this chapter</u>; and
- 4 (B) directly or indirectly charges a fee for the
- 5 performance of acupuncture services.
