H.B. No. 3230

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to an expedited credentialing process for certain Medicaid
- 3 providers.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 531.001, Government Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subdivision (4-c) to read as follows:
- 7 (4-c) "Medicaid managed care organization" means a
- 8 managed care organization as defined by Section 533.001 that
- 9 contracts with the commission under Chapter 533 to provide health
- 10 care services to Medicaid recipients.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 531.02118, Government Code, is amended
- 12 by amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsection (e) to read as
- 13 follows:
- 14 (c) In streamlining the Medicaid provider credentialing
- 15 process under this section, the commission may designate a
- 16 centralized credentialing entity and may:
- 17 (1) share information in the database established
- 18 under Subchapter C, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code, with the
- 19 centralized credentialing entity; and
- 20 (2) require all <u>Medicaid</u> managed care organizations
- 21 [contracting with the commission to provide health care services to
- 22 Medicaid recipients under a managed care plan issued by the
- 23 organization] to use the centralized credentialing entity as a hub
- 24 for the collection and sharing of information.

- 1 (e) The commission shall develop an expedited credentialing
- 2 process for a physician licensed in this state and require all
- 3 Medicaid managed care organizations to use the process.
- 4 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 5 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 6 Services Commission shall develop and implement the expedited
- 7 credentialing process described by Section 531.02118(e),
- 8 Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 9 SECTION 4. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 10 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 11 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 12 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 13 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 14 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 15 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
