4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 554.001, Government Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	Sec. 554.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
8	(1) "Law" means:
9	(A) a state or federal statute;
10	(B) an ordinance of a local governmental entity;
11	or
12	(C) a rule adopted under a statute or ordinance.
13	(2) "Local governmental entity" means a political
14	subdivision of the state, including [a]:
15	(A) <u>a</u> county;
16	(B) <u>a</u> municipality;
17	(C) <u>a</u> public school district; [or]
18	(D) <u>a</u> special-purpose district or authority; or
19	(E) an open-enrollment charter school.
20	(3) "Personnel action" means an action that affects a
21	public employee's compensation, promotion, demotion, transfer,
22	work assignment, or performance evaluation.
23	(4) "Public employee" means an employee or appointed
24	officer other than an independent contractor who is paid to perform

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1 services for a state or local governmental entity.

(5) "State governmental entity" means:

(A) a board, commission, department, office, or
other agency in the executive branch of state government, created
under the constitution or a statute of the state, including an
institution of higher education, as defined by Section 61.003,
Education Code;

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(B) the legislature or a legislative agency; or

9 (C) the Texas Supreme Court, the Texas Court of 10 Criminal Appeals, a court of appeals, a state judicial agency, or 11 the State Bar of Texas.

SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply to a 12 suspension or termination of employment of a public employee or to 13 14 other adverse personnel action taken against an employee on or 15 after the effective date of this Act. A suspension or termination of employment of a public employee or other adverse personnel 16 17 action against the employee that is take before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law existing on the date the 18 19 suspension, termination, or other adverse personnel action occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for that 20 21 purpose.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
