2	relating to Medicaid reimbursement for medication-assisted
3	treatment for opioid or substance use disorder.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
6	is amended by adding Section 32.03115 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 32.03115. REIMBURSEMENT FOR MEDICATION-ASSISTED
8	TREATMENT FOR OPIOID OR SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER. (a) In this
9	section, "medication-assisted opioid or substance use disorder
10	treatment" means the use of methadone, buprenorphine, or naltrexone
11	to treat opioid or substance use disorder.
12	(b) Notwithstanding Sections 531.072 and 531.073,
13	Government Code, or any other law and subject to Subsection (c), the
14	commission shall provide medical assistance reimbursement for
15	medication-assisted opioid or substance use disorder treatment
16	without requiring a recipient of medical assistance or health care
17	provider to obtain prior authorization or precertification for the
18	treatment.
19	(c) The commission may provide medical assistance
20	reimbursement for medication-assisted opioid or substance use
21	disorder treatment only if the treatment is prescribed to a
22	recipient of medical assistance by a licensed health care provider
23	who is authorized to prescribe methadone, buprenorphine, or
24	<u>naltrexone.</u>

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1 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act 2 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a 3 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision, 4 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or 5 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the 6 waiver or authorization is granted.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
