1	(A) except as provided by Paragraph (C), the
2	municipality shall transfer donated time to the employee
3	organization's business leave time account from the accumulated
4	vacation or compensatory time of each firefighter who is a member of
5	the employee organization in the amount approved by vote of the
6	employee organization not to exceed the amount allowed under
7	Subsection (c);
8	(B) the municipality shall transfer the donated
9	time to the account monthly beginning with the first calendar month
10	that begins after the date of the employee organization vote
11	requiring contributions; and
12	(C) each year, during the period beginning on the
13	60th day before the anniversary of the first day of the first
14	calendar month in which donations were first transferred to the
15	business leave time account of the employee organization under
16	Paragraph (B) and ending on the 30th day before that anniversary, a
