The bond must: 5 6 [(1) be issued by a corporate surety company authorized to issue surety bonds in this state; 7 8 [(2) be satisfactory to the department and payable to 9 the department for the use and benefit of the corporation; [(3) obligate the principal and surety to pay any 10 monetary loss to the corporation through an act of fraud, 11 dishonesty, forgery, theft, embezzlement, or wilful misapplication 12 by a covered officer, whether acting alone or with other persons, 13 while employed as or exercising the powers of an officer designated 14 15 under Subsection (a); and 16 [(4) be in an amount of at least \$25,000 for each 17 officer covered. [(c) Instead of the bond required by Subsection (b), an 18 officer designated under Subsection (a) may deposit with the 19 department cash or securities approved by the department in the 20 amount and subject to the conditions applicable to the bond. 21 22 [(d) Successive recoveries may be made on a bond under this section until the amount of the bond is exhausted. 23 24 SECTION 9. - 18 attorney must be licensed to practice law in the jurisdiction in

- 22 must maintain the number of contracting attorneys that the
- 23 department determines is necessary to service the participant
