## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to authorizing a health and wellness center fee at the

- 3 University of Houston-Victoria.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 54, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 54.5406 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 54.5406. HEALTH AND WELLNESS CENTER FEE; UNIVERSITY OF
- 8 HOUSTON-VICTORIA. (a) The board of regents of the University of
- 9 Houston System may charge each student enrolled at the University
- 10 of Houston-Victoria a health and wellness center fee. The fee may be
- 11 used only for the purpose of financing, constructing, operating,
- 12 maintaining, improving, and equipping a health and wellness center
- 13 at the University of Houston-Victoria. A fee charged under this
- 14 section is in addition to any use or service fee authorized to be
- 15 charged under other law.
- 16 (b) The health and wellness center fee may not be charged
- 17 unless the charging of the fee is approved by a majority vote of the
- 18 students enrolled at the university participating in a general
- 19 student election held for that purpose.
- 20 <u>(c) The amount of a fee charged under this section may not</u>
- 21 exceed:
- 22 (1) \$150 per student for each regular semester;
- 23 (2) \$100 per student for each summer session of 10
- 24 weeks or longer; or

- 1 (3) \$50 per student for each summer session of less
- 2 than 10 weeks.
- 3 (d) Revenue from a fee charged under this section shall be
- 4 deposited to the credit of an account known as the University of
- 5 Houston-Victoria Health and Wellness Center Fee Account under the
- 6 control of the university's student fee advisory committee.
- 7 Annually, the committee shall submit to the president of the
- 8 university its recommendation for any change to the amount of the
- 9 fee and a complete and itemized budget for the health and wellness
- 10 center together with a complete report of all health and wellness
- 11 center activities conducted during the past year and all
- 12 expenditures made in connection with those activities. The
- 13 president shall submit the budget to the board of regents as part of
- 14 the university's institutional budget. The board of regents may
- 15 make changes in the budget that the board determines are necessary.
- (e) The board of regents may increase the amount of a fee
- 17 charged under this section, except that a fee increase by 10 percent
- 18 or more of the amount of the fee charged during the preceding
- 19 academic year must be approved by a majority vote of students
- 20 enrolled at the university participating in a general student
- 21 election held for that purpose.
- 22 <u>(f) The health and wellness center fee is not considered in</u>
- 23 determining the maximum amount of student services fees that may be
- 24 charged under Section 54.503.
- 25 (g) For purposes of determining whether to waive the
- 26 imposition of the fee as provided under Section 54.5035, a student
- 27 is not reasonably able to use the health and wellness center for

- 1 which a fee is imposed under this section if the student lives more
- 2 than 50 miles outside the corporate limits of Victoria, Texas.
- 3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
