1	AN ACT
2	relating to authorizing a recreation and wellness center fee at the
3	University of Houston-Victoria.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 54, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 54.5406 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 54.5406. RECREATION AND WELLNESS CENTER FEE;
8	UNIVERSITY OF HOUSTON-VICTORIA. (a) The board of regents of the
9	University of Houston System may charge each student enrolled at
10	the University of Houston-Victoria a recreation and wellness center
11	fee. The fee may be used only for the purpose of financing,
12	constructing, operating, maintaining, improving, and equipping a
13	recreation and wellness center at the University of
14	Houston-Victoria. A fee charged under this section is in addition
15	to any use or service fee authorized to be charged under other law.
16	(b) The recreation and wellness center fee may not be
17	charged unless the charging of the fee is approved by a majority
18	vote of the students enrolled at the university participating in a
19	general student election held for that purpose.
20	(c) The amount of a fee charged under this section may not
21	exceed:
22	(1) \$150 per student for each regular semester;
23	(2) \$100 per student for each summer session of 10
24	weeks or longer; or

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1	(3) \$50 per student for each summer session of less
2	than 10 weeks.
3	(d) Revenue from a fee charged under this section shall be
4	deposited to the credit of an account known as the University of
5	Houston-Victoria Recreation and Wellness Center Fee Account under
6	the control of the university's student fee advisory committee.
7	Annually, the committee shall submit to the president of the
8	university its recommendation for any change to the amount of the
9	fee and a complete and itemized budget for the recreation and
10	wellness center together with a complete report of all recreation
11	and wellness center activities conducted during the past year and
12	all expenditures made in connection with those activities. The
13	president shall submit the budget to the board of regents as part of
14	the university's institutional budget. The board of regents may
15	make changes in the budget that the board determines are necessary.
16	(e) The board of regents may increase the amount of a fee
17	charged under this section, except that a fee increase by 10 percent
18	or more of the amount of the fee charged during the preceding
19	academic year must be approved by a majority vote of students
20	enrolled at the university participating in a general student
21	election held for that purpose.
22	(f) The recreation and wellness center fee is not considered
23	in determining the maximum amount of student services fees that may
24	be charged under Section 54.503.
25	(g) For purposes of determining whether to waive the
26	imposition of the fee as provided under Section 54.5035, a student
27	is not reasonably able to use the recreation and wellness center for

which a fee is imposed under this section if the student lives more than 50 miles outside the corporate limits of Victoria, Texas.

3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
