A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to eliminating certain state-required assessment
3	instruments and certain end-of-course assessment instruments not
4	required by federal law.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 39.023, Education Code, is amended by
7	amending Subsections (a), (c), (c-2), and (c-3) and adding
8	Subsection (q) to read as follows:
9	(a) The agency shall adopt or develop appropriate
10	criterion-referenced assessment instruments designed to assess
11	essential knowledge and skills in reading, [writing,] mathematics,
12	[social studies,] and science. Except as provided by Subsection
13	(a-2), all students, other than students assessed under Subsection
14	(b) or (1) or exempted under Section 39.027, shall be assessed in:
15	(1) mathematics, annually in grades three through
16	seven without the aid of technology and in grade eight with the aid
17	of technology on any assessment instrument that includes algebra;
18	(2) reading, annually in grades three through eight;
19	(3) [writing, including spelling and grammar, in
20	grades four and seven;
21	[(4) social studies, in grade eight;
22	$\left[\frac{(5)}{(5)}\right]$ science, in grades five and eight; and
23	(4) [(6)] any other subject and grade required by
24	federal law.

1 (c) The agency shall also adopt end-of-course assessment instruments for secondary-level courses in reading, mathematics, 2 and science only as necessary to comply with the Every Student 3 Succeeds Act (20 U.S.C. Section 6301 et seq.) to be administered 4 only as necessary to meet the minimum requirements of that Act 5 [Algebra I, biology, English I, English II, and United States 6 history. The Algebra I end-of-course assessment instrument must be 7 administered with the aid of technology. The English I and English 8 II end-of-course assessment instruments must each assess essential 9 10 knowledge and skills in both reading and writing in the same assessment instrument and must provide a single score]. A school 11 district shall comply with State Board of Education rules regarding 12 administration of the assessment instruments adopted under [listed 13 14 in] this subsection. If a student is in a special education program 15 under Subchapter A, Chapter 29, the student's admission, review, and dismissal committee shall determine whether any allowable 16 17 modification is necessary in administering to the student an assessment instrument required under this subsection. The State 18 Board of Education shall administer the assessment instruments. 19 The State Board of Education shall adopt a schedule for the 20 administration of end-of-course assessment instruments that 21 complies with the requirements of Subsection (c-3). 22 23 (c-2) The agency may adopt end-of-course assessment

- 3 (c-3) In adopting a schedule for the administration of
- 4 assessment instruments under this section, the State Board of
- 5 Education shall require:
- 6 (1) assessment instruments administered under

- 8 assessment instrument is administered at least two weeks later than
- 9 the date on which the first assessment instrument was administered
- 10 under Subsection (a) during the 2006-2007 school year; and
- 11 (2) the spring administration of end-of-course
- 12 assessment instruments under Subsection (c) to occur in each school
- 13 district not earlier than the first full week in May, except that
- 14 the spring administration of an [the] end-of-course assessment
- 15 <u>instrument</u> [instruments] in reading [English I and English II] must

- 17 (q) Notwithstanding any provision of this section or other
- 18 law, if changes made to the Every Student Succeeds Act (20 U.S.C.
- 19 Section 6301 et seq.) reduce the number or frequency of assessment
- 20 instruments required to be administered to students, the State
- 21 Board of Education shall adopt rules reducing the number or
- 22 frequency of assessment instruments administered to students under
- 23 state law, and the commissioner shall ensure that students are not
- 24 assessed in subject areas or in grades that are no longer required
- 25 to meet the minimum requirements of that Act.
- SECTION 2. Section 39.025(a-1), Education Code, is amended
- 27 to read as follows:

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- 1 (a-1) A student enrolled in a college preparatory mathematics or English language arts course under Section 28.014 2 3 who satisfies the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) college readiness benchmarks prescribed by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating 4 5 Board under Section 51.334 on an assessment instrument designated by the coordinating board under that section administered at the 6 end of the college preparatory mathematics or English language arts 7 8 course satisfies the requirements concerning and is exempt from the administration of the mathematics or reading [Algebra I or the 9 English I and English II] end-of-course assessment <u>instrument</u> 10 adopted under Section 39.023(c) [instruments], as applicable, [as 11 prescribed by Section 39.023(c), even if the student did not 12 perform satisfactorily on a previous administration of 13 14 applicable end-of-course assessment instrument. A student who 15 fails to perform satisfactorily on the assessment instrument designated by the coordinating board under Section 51.334 16 17 administered as provided by this subsection may retake that assessment instrument for purposes of this subsection or may take 18 19 the appropriate end-of-course assessment instrument.
- 20 SECTION 3. Section 39.203(c), Education Code, is amended to 21 read as follows:
- 22 (c) In addition to the distinction designations described 23 by Subsections (a) and (b), a campus that satisfies the criteria 24 developed under Section 39.204 shall be awarded a distinction 25 designation by the commissioner for outstanding performance in 26 academic achievement in <u>reading</u> [<u>English language arts</u>], 27 mathematics, <u>or</u> science[, or social studies].

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- 1 SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2019-2020
- 2 school year.
- 3 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
