H.B. No. 3365

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the civil liability of certain persons providing 3 disaster assistance. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 79.003, Civil Practice and Remedies 5 Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 Sec. 79.003. DISASTER ASSISTANCE. (a) Except in a case of reckless conduct or intentional, wilful, or wanton misconduct, a 8 9 person is immune from civil liability for an act or omission that occurs in giving care, assistance, or advice with respect to the 10 11 management of an incident: 12 (1) that is a man-made or natural disaster that endangers or threatens to endanger individuals, property, or the 13 environment, including a major disaster declared by the president 14 of the United States or a disaster declared under Section 418.014, 15 16 Government Code; and (2) in which the care, assistance, or advice is 17 provided at the request of: 18 (A) an authorized representative of a local, 19 state, or federal agency, including a fire department, <u>a</u> police 20 department, an emergency management agency, and a disaster response 21 22 agency; or 23 (B) a charitable organization, as that term is 24 defined by Section 84.003, that provides services to mitigate the

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effects of a disaster described by Subdivision (1).

2 (b) <u>Subsection (a)</u> [This section] does not apply to a person 3 giving care, assistance, or advice for or in expectation of 4 compensation from or on behalf of the recipient of the care, 5 assistance, or advice in excess of reimbursement for expenses 6 incurred.

7 (c) Notwithstanding Chapter 101 or any other law, an entity 8 and the authorized representative of the entity are not liable 9 under the laws of this state for the act or omission of a person 10 providing care, assistance, or advice on request under Subsection 11 (a)(2)(A).

12 (d) Notwithstanding Chapter 84 or any other law, a 13 charitable organization is not liable under the laws of this state 14 for the act or omission of a person providing care, assistance, or 15 advice on request under Subsection (a)(2)(B).

16 (e) The immunities provided by this section are in addition 17 to any other immunity or limitations of liability provided by law, 18 including Subchapter D, Chapter 74, this chapter, or Chapter 78 or 19 78A of this code or Section 418.006, Government Code.

20 SECTION 2. Section 79.003, Civil Practice and Remedies 21 Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to a cause of action that 22 accrues on or after the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
