A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to an alert for a missing person with a guardian. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter L, Chapter 411, 5 Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 SUBCHAPTER L. STATEWIDE AMERICA'S MISSING: BROADCAST EMERGENCY RESPONSE (AMBER) ALERT SYSTEM FOR ABDUCTED CHILDREN AND CERTAIN 7 OTHER MISSING PERSONS [WITH INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES] 8 SECTION 2. Section 411.351, Government Code, is amended by 9 amending Subdivisions (2), (2-a), (3), and (3-a) and adding 10 11 Subdivisions (2-b) and (3-b) to read as follows: 12 (2) "Alert system" means the statewide America's Missing: Broadcast Emergency Response (AMBER) alert system for 13 14 abducted children and certain other missing persons [with intellectual disabilities]. 15 (2-a) "Guardian" has the meaning assigned by Section 16 1002.012, Estates Code. 17 (2-b) "Intellectual disability" means significantly 18 subaverage general intellectual functioning that is concurrent 19 20 with deficits in adaptive behavior and originates during the developmental period. The term includes a pervasive developmental 21 22 disorder. "Local law enforcement agency" means a local law 23 (3) 24 enforcement agency with jurisdiction over the investigation of:

1 (A) the abduction of a child; [or] 2 (B) missing person with an intellectual a 3 disability; or 4 (C) a missing person with a guardian. 5 (3-a) "Person with a guardian" means a person for whom a guardian has been appointed. 6 (3-b) "Pervasive developmental disorder" means 7 а 8 disorder that meets the criteria for a pervasive developmental disorder established in the most recent Diagnostic and Statistical 9 10 Manual of Mental Disorders published by the American Psychiatric Association. 11 SECTION 3. Section 411.352, Government Code, is amended to 12 read as follows: 13 Sec. 411.352. STATEWIDE 14 AMERICA'S MISSING: BROADCAST EMERGENCY RESPONSE (AMBER) ALERT SYSTEM FOR ABDUCTED CHILDREN AND 15 CERTAIN OTHER MISSING PERSONS [WITH INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES]. 16 17 With the cooperation of the Texas Department of Transportation, the office of the governor, and other appropriate law enforcement 18 19 agencies in this state, the department shall develop and implement a statewide alert system to be activated on behalf of an abducted 20 child, [or] a missing person with an intellectual disability, or a 21

22 missing person with a guardian.

23 SECTION 4. Section 411.355(b), Government Code, is amended 24 to read as follows:

(b) On the request of a local law enforcement agency regarding a missing person with an intellectual disability <u>or a</u> <u>missing person with a guardian</u>, the department shall activate the

1 alert system and notify appropriate participants in the alert system, as established by rule, if: 2 3 (1) the local law enforcement agency receives notice of a missing person with an intellectual disability or with a 4 5 guardian; 6 (2) the local law enforcement agency verifies that at 7 the time the person is reported missing: the person<u>, as applicable:</u> 8 (A) (i) has an intellectual disability, 9 as 10 determined according to the procedure provided by Section 593.005, Health and Safety Code; or 11 12 (ii) has a guardian; and the person's location is unknown; 13 (B) 14 (3) the local law enforcement agency determines that 15 the person's disappearance poses a credible threat to the person's health and safety; and 16 17 (4) sufficient information is available to disseminate to the public that could assist in locating the person. 18 19 SECTION 5. Sections 411.358 and 411.359, Government Code, are amended to read as follows: 20 Sec. 411.358. TERMINATION. The director shall terminate 21 any activation of the alert system with respect to a particular 22 23 abducted child, [or a particular] missing person with an 24 intellectual disability, or missing person with a guardian if: 25 (1) the abducted child or missing person is recovered 26 or the situation is otherwise resolved; or 27 (2) the director determines that the alert system is

no longer an effective tool for locating and recovering the
abducted child or missing person.

3 Sec. 411.359. SYSTEM NAME. The director by rule may assign 4 a name other than America's Missing: Broadcast Emergency Response 5 (AMBER) to the alert system when the system is activated regarding a 6 missing person with an intellectual disability <u>or a missing person</u> 7 with a guardian.

8 SECTION 6. Not later than December 1, 2019, the Public 9 Safety Commission shall adopt rules and the public safety director 10 of the Department of Public Safety of the State of Texas shall issue 11 directives necessary to implement Subchapter L, Chapter 411, 12 Government Code, as amended by this Act.

13 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
