10	year, the land office shall enter into indefinite quantity
11	contracts with vendors to provide information management services,
12	construction services, including engineering construction
13	services, and other services the land office determines may be
14	necessary to construct, repair, or rebuild property or
15	infrastructure in the event of a natural disaster.
16	(b) The terms of a contract under Subsection (a) must
17	provide that the contract is contingent on:
18	(1) the availability of funds;
19	(2) the occurrence of a natural disaster not later
