- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 263.152(a), Local Government Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) The commissioners court of a county may:
- 7 (1) periodically sell the county's surplus or salvage
- 8 property by competitive bid or auction, except that competitive
- 9 bidding or an auction is not necessary if the purchaser is another
- 10 county or a political subdivision within the county that is selling
- 11 the surplus or salvage property;
- 12 (2) offer the property as a trade-in for new property
- 13 of the same general type if the commissioners court considers that
- 14 action to be in the best interests of the county;
- 15 (3) order any of the property to be destroyed or
- 16 otherwise disposed of as worthless if the commissioners court
- 17 undertakes to sell that property under Subdivision (1) and is
- 18 unable to do so because no bids are made;
- 19 (4) dispose of the property by donating it to a civic
- 20 or charitable organization located in the county if the
- 21 commissioners court determines that:
- (A) undertaking to sell the property under
- 23 Subdivision (1) would likely result in no bids or a bid price that
- 24 is less than the county's expenses required for the bid process;

Τ	(B) the donation serves a public purpose; and
2	(C) the organization will provide the county with
3	adequate consideration, such as relieving the county of
4	transportation or disposal expenses related to the property;
5	(5) transfer gambling equipment in the possession of
6	the county following its forfeiture to the state to the Texas
7	Facilities [Building and Procurement] Commission for sale under

9	(6) order any vehicle retired under a program designed
10	to encourage the use of low-emission vehicles to be crushed and
11	recycled, if practicable, without a competitive bid or auction; or
12	(7) by order or resolution, transfer a retired law

14	SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 263, Local Government
15	Code, is amended by adding Section 263.159 to read as follows:
16	Sec. 263.159. TRANSFER OF RETIRED COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT
17	DOG. (a) The commissioners court of a county may transfer a county
18	<pre>law enforcement dog that is:</pre>
19	(1) at the end of the dog's working life; or
20	(2) otherwise surplus to the needs of the county.
21	(b) The commissioners court may transfer a county law
22	enforcement dog described by Subsection (a) only to:
23	(1) the dog's current or former handler; or
24	(2) another current or former law enforcement officer.
25	(c) A transfer under this section:
26	(1) may be made without charge to the transferee if the
27	transferee agrees to house and otherwise care for the dog; and

- 1 (2) must be made in a manner that is in the best
- 2 <u>interest of the dog and the county</u>, as determined by the county.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
