A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to the designation of centers of excellence for the early
3	diagnosis and treatment of placental disorders.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 32, Health and Safety Code, is amended by
6	adding Subchapter E to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER E. CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE FOR EARLY DIAGNOSIS AND
8	TREATMENT OF PLACENTAL DISORDERS
9	Sec. 32.101. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "placental
10	disorder" includes placenta accreta, placenta increta, and
11	placenta percreta.
12	Sec. 32.102. DESIGNATION OF CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE. (a) The
13	department, in consultation with the maternal mortality and
14	morbidity task force established under Chapter 34, shall designate
15	as centers of excellence for the early diagnosis and treatment of
16	placental disorders one or more health care entities or programs in
17	this state, including institutions of higher education or programs
18	of those institutions.
19	(b) The executive commissioner, in consultation with the
20	department and the maternal mortality and morbidity task force,
21	shall adopt rules necessary for a health care entity or program in
22	this state to be designated as a center of excellence for early
23	diagnosis and treatment of placental disorders.
24	Sec. 32.103. SUBCOMMITTEE. (a) The department, in

- 1 consultation with the maternal mortality and morbidity task force,
- 2 shall appoint a subcommittee of the task force to advise the
- 3 executive commissioner on the adoption of rules under Section
- 4 32.102. As part of the subcommittee's duties under this
- 5 subsection, the subcommittee specifically shall advise the
- 6 executive commissioner on the criteria necessary for a health care
- 7 entity or program in this state to receive a designation under this
- 8 subchapter.
- 9 (b) The subcommittee must consist of individuals with
- 10 expertise in the early diagnosis and treatment of placental
- 11 disorders. A majority of the members of the subcommittee must
- 12 practice in those areas in a health profession in this state. The
- 13 subcommittee may include national and international experts.
- 14 Sec. 32.104. PRIORITY CONSIDERATIONS FOR CENTER
- 15 DESIGNATIONS. The rules adopted under Section 32.102 must
- 16 prioritize awarding a designation under this subchapter to a health
- 17 care entity or program that:
- 18 (1) offers early diagnosis and treatment services for
- 19 placental disorders through a multi-specialty clinical program
- 20 that is affiliated and collaborates extensively with a medical
- 21 school in this state and an associated hospital that provides
- 22 advanced maternal and neonatal care in accordance with the
- 23 hospital's level of care designation received under Section
- 24 241.<u>182;</u>
- 25 (2) demonstrates a significant commitment to research
- 26 in and advancing the field of placental disorder care;
- 27 (3) offers advanced training programs in the early

- 1 diagnosis and treatment of placental disorders; and
- 2 (4) integrates an advanced placental disorder care
- 3 program with a program that provides appropriate long-term
- 4 monitoring and follow-up care for patients.
- 5 Sec. 32.105. REQUIREMENTS FOR DESIGNATION. The rules
- 6 adopted under Section 32.102 must ensure that a health care entity
- 7 or program in this state that receives a center of excellence
- 8 designation under this subchapter:
- 9 (1) provides or is affiliated with a hospital that
- 10 provides advanced maternal and neonatal care in accordance with the
- 11 hospital's level of care designation received under Section
- 12 241.182;
- 13 (2) implements and maintains a multidisciplinary
- 14 health care team, including maternal fetal medicine specialists,
- 15 pediatric and surgical specialists, neonatologists, nurses with
- 16 specialized maternal and neonatal training, and other ancillary and
- 17 support staff as appropriate to provide care related to placental
- 18 disorders;
- 19 (3) establishes minimum criteria for medical staff,
- 20 nursing staff, and ancillary and support staff;
- 21 (4) measures short-term and long-term patient
- 22 diagnostic and therapeutic outcomes; and
- 23 (5) provides to the department annual reports
- 24 containing aggregate data on short-term and long-term diagnostic
- 25 and therapeutic outcomes as requested or required by the department
- 26 and makes those reports available to the public on the entity's or
- 27 program's Internet website.

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- 1 SECTION 2. (a) Not later than December 1, 2019, the
- 2 Department of State Health Services, in consultation with the
- 3 maternal mortality and morbidity task force established under
- 4 Chapter 34, Health and Safety Code, shall appoint members to the
- 5 subcommittee as required by Section 32.103, Health and Safety Code,
- 6 as added by this Act.
- 7 (b) Not later than December 1, 2020, the executive
- 8 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 9 adopt rules as required by Section 32.102, Health and Safety Code,
- 10 as added by this Act.
- 11 (c) Not later than September 1, 2021, the Department of
- 12 State Health Services shall begin awarding designations of centers
- 13 of excellence as required by Subchapter E, Chapter 32, Health and
- 14 Safety Code, as added by this Act.
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
