A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the establishment of a task force on sex-based
- 3 harassment in public schools.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 37, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 37.0834 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 37.0834. TASK FORCE ON SEX-BASED HARASSMENT IN
- 8 SCHOOLS. (a) In this section:
- 9 <u>(1) "Sex-based harassment" includes "dating</u>
- 10 violence," "sexual assault," "sexual harassment," and "stalking,"
- 11 as those terms are defined in Section 51.9365.
- 12 (2) "Task force" means the task force on sex-based
- 13 <u>harassment in public schools established under this section.</u>
- 14 (3) "Title IX" means Title IX of the Education
- 15 Amendments of 1972 (20 U.S.C. Section 1681 et seq.).
- 16 (b) The agency shall establish a task force on sex-based
- 17 harassment in public schools to evaluate and provide
- 18 <u>recommendations on:</u>
- 19 <u>(1) the prevalence of incidents of sex-based</u>
- 20 harassment against students on campuses of public schools;
- 21 (2) current federal, state, and local laws and rules
- 22 related to sex-based harassment;
- 23 (3) the barriers to creation and implementation of
- 24 policies, procedures, and programs to prevent sex-based harassment

- 1 in public schools;
 2 (4) st
- 2 (4) strategies for collecting data on the prevalence
- 3 of sex-based harassment and the response by public schools to
- 4 incidents of sex-based harassment;
- 5 (5) best practices for the agency to provide guidance
- 6 and support to public schools regarding sex-based harassment;
- 7 (6) best practices for public schools providing
- 8 guidance and support to students regarding sex-based harassment;
- 9 and
- 10 (7) any other issues identified by the task force
- 11 related to sex-based harassment in public schools.
- 12 (c) The task force is composed of 15 members appointed by
- 13 the commissioner. The commissioner shall appoint:
- 14 (1) two members who represent nonprofit organizations
- 15 that focus on mental health or trauma;
- 16 (2) one member who represents a nonprofit organization
- 17 that focuses on youth;
- 18 (3) two members who represent legal advocacy nonprofit
- 19 organizations;
- 20 (4) three members who represent nonprofit
- 21 organizations that focus on gender-based or interpersonal
- 22 violence;
- 23 (5) one member who represents a nonprofit organization
- 24 that focuses on schools;
- 25 (6) two members who are school district employees or
- 26 members of a local school health advisory council;
- 27 (7) one member who has served as a Title IX coordinator

- 1 at a school district or an institution of higher education;
- 2 (8) one parent or guardian of a student enrolled in a
- 3 public school in this state;
- 4 (9) one member of the public who is under 25 years of
- 5 age; and
- 6 (10) one member who is an agency employee.
- 7 (d) The commissioner shall select one member to serve as the
- 8 presiding officer of the task force.
- 9 (e) Members of the task force serve at the will of the
- 10 commissioner. A vacancy on the task force must be filled in the same
- 11 manner as the original appointment.
- 12 (f) The task force shall meet at least four times at the call
- 13 of the presiding officer and at any other times determined by the
- 14 presiding officer.
- 15 (g) A task force member is not entitled to compensation for
- 16 service on the task force but is entitled to reimbursement for
- 17 actual and necessary expenses incurred in performing task force
- 18 duties. The task force may accept gifts, grants, and donations to
- 19 pay for those expenses.
- 20 (h) In determining best practices for public schools, the
- 21 task force must evaluate and provide recommendations related to:
- (1) improving student and parent or guardian awareness
- 23 of school policies and student rights, including awareness of:
- 24 (A) how to access information about a school
- 25 district's sex-based harassment policy;
- 26 (B) how to report sex-based harassment,
- 27 including how to contact a school district's Title IX coordinator;

1	(C) investigation procedures and associated
2	rights and policies for the accused and complainant in sex-based
3	harassment incidents;
4	(D) counseling and mental health services
5	available on campus or by referral to off-campus resources for
6	students who experience sex-based harassment; and
7	(E) accommodations available to support students
8	who experience sex-based harassment; and
9	(2) school district policies and procedures,
10	including:
11	(A) providing information to students,
12	guardians, school employees, and members of the public in languages
13	prevalent in the school district on the district's sex-based
14	harassment policies and procedures and contact information for each
15	school's Title IX coordinator;
16	(B) professional development training for school
17	district employees that includes:
18	(i) training in trauma-informed practices;
19	(ii) information relating to the contents
20	of Title IX regarding sex-based harassment;
21	(iii) reporting and investigation
22	procedures, including the referral of a student or parent or
23	guardian to the Title IX coordinator; and
24	(iv) any other training relevant to the
25	implementation of Title IX in public schools;
26	(C) hearing procedures for ensuring due process
27	for a person who experiences sex-based harassment and a person

- 1 accused of sex-based harassment;
- 2 (D) providing trauma-informed counseling or
- 3 mental health services on public school campuses or referring
- 4 students to off-campus mental health services;
- 5 (E) enabling public schools to evaluate the need
- 6 for and provide necessary academic or other accommodations to
- 7 students affected by sex-based harassment; and
- 8 <u>(F) any other issues identified by the task force</u>
- 9 regarding sex-based harassment and the implementation of Title IX
- 10 in public schools.
- 11 (i) The agency, using existing resources, shall provide
- 12 <u>administrative support for the task force.</u>
- 13 <u>(j) Not later than August 31, 2020, the task force shall</u>
- 14 submit a written report to the governor, the lieutenant governor,
- 15 the speaker of the house of representatives, and the commissioner
- 16 that includes the task force's findings and recommendations,
- 17 including any recommended changes to state law.
- 18 (k) The task force is abolished and this section expires on
- 19 June 1, 2021.
- 20 SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2019, the
- 21 commissioner of education shall appoint the members of the task
- 22 force established under Section 37.0834, Education Code, as added
- 23 by this Act.
- 24 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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1 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
