4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 29, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter Z-1 to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER Z-1. COMMISSION ON TEXAS WORKFORCE OF THE FUTURE
8	Sec. 29.951. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "commission"
9	means the Commission on Texas Workforce of the Future.
10	Sec. 29.952. COMMISSION ON TEXAS WORKFORCE OF THE FUTURE.
11	(a) The Commission on Texas Workforce of the Future is established
12	to engage business, state agencies, and local workforce system
13	partners in the efforts of state and local authorities to build the
14	state's workforce talent pipeline.
15	(b) The commission members shall provide reliable and
16	accurate data pertinent to college and career readiness,
17	industry-based workforce credentials, associate and bachelor's
18	degree programs, and high-demand industry jobs and careers.
19	(c) The commission is composed of 17 members as follows:
20	(1) five members appointed by the governor;
21	(2) four members appointed by the lieutenant governor;
22	(3) four members appointed by the speaker of the house
23	of representatives;
24	(4) the commissioner of higher education or the

1	commissioner's designee;
2	(5) a commissioner of the Texas Workforce Commission
3	appointed by the chair of the Texas Workforce Commission, or the
4	<pre>commissioner's designee;</pre>
5	(6) the commissioner or the commissioner's designee;
6	<u>and</u>
7	(7) the chair of the Texas Economic Development
8	Corporation.
9	(d) The members appointed by the governor must have an
10	interest in the future of the state's workforce. In appointing the
11	members, the governor shall consider appointing a business leader
12	representing each of the following industries:
13	(1) oil and gas;
14	(2) technology and manufacturing;
15	(3) health care;
16	(4) construction; and
17	(5) petrochemicals.
18	(e) The appointments made by the lieutenant governor must
19	<u>include:</u>
20	(1) two members of the senate;
21	(2) an administrator in the public school system or an
22	elected member of the board of trustees of a school district; and
23	(3) an administrator of a four-year public institution
24	of higher education.
25	(f) The appointments made by the speaker of the house of
26	representatives must include:
27	(1) two members of the house of representatives;

1 (2) an administrator in the public school system or an 2 elected member of the board of trustees of a school district; and 3 (3) an administrator of a public junior college. 4 (g) In making appointments under Subsection (c), the 5 governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives shall coordinate to ensure that the members they 6 7 appoint reflect, to the extent possible, the ethnic and geographic 8 diversity of this state. Sec. 29.953. PRESIDING OFFICER. The governor shall 9 designate the presiding officer of the commission. The presiding 10 11 officer must be a business executive. 12 Sec. 29.954. COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT. A member of the commission is not entitled to compensation for service on the 13 commission but is entitled to reimbursement for actual and 14 15 necessary expenses incurred in performing commission duties. Sec. 29.955. ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT AND FUNDING. 16 17 Staff members of the agency shall provide administrative support for the commission. 18 19 (b) Funding for the administrative and operational expenses of the commission shall be provided by appropriation to the agency. 20 21 Sec. 29.956. RECOMMENDATIONS. (a) The commission shall 22 develop recommendations under this subchapter to address issues related to workforce development and the future of the state's 23 24 workforce, including: (1) strengthening and supporting industry-led 25 26 public-private partnerships that connect people with careers and

match employers with skilled talent;

- 1 (2) improving regional coordination and alignment
- 2 between industry, the public workforce system, higher education
- 3 institutions, public schools, and community-based organizations to
- 4 create college and career pathways that lead to good jobs;
- 5 (3) attracting, educating, developing, and placing
- 6 workers in high-demand industry sectors;
- 7 (4) addressing the current and future skills gap
- 8 across the state economy and identifying statewide initiatives to
- 9 enhance cross-sector collaboration, communication, and alignment;
- 10 (5) identifying incentives to encourage cooperation
- 11 between sectors that fosters innovative approaches to meet the
- 12 current and future workforce demands; and
- 13 (6) recommending statutory changes to the laws
- 14 governing the public workforce system, public education, and higher
- 15 education to enhance career path options and ensure long-term
- 16 <u>collaboration with industry.</u>
- 17 (b) The commission may establish one or more work groups
- 18 composed of not more than five members of the commission to study,
- 19 discuss, and address specific policy issues and recommendations to
- 20 refer to the commission for consideration. In establishing a work
- 21 group under this subsection, the commission shall ensure that the
- 22 membership of the work group includes at least two representatives
- 23 from the business community.
- Sec. 29.957. REPORT. Not later than December 31, 2020, the
- 25 commission shall prepare and deliver a report to the governor and
- 26 the legislature that includes recommendations for statutory and
- 27 regulatory changes to enhance workforce development and

- 1 coordination and alignment between industry, public education, and
- 2 higher education, including any adjustments to college and career
- 3 pathway programs.
- 4 Sec. 29.958. PUBLIC MEETINGS AND PUBLIC INFORMATION. (a)
- 5 The commission may hold public meetings as needed to fulfill the
- 6 commission's duties under this subchapter.
- 7 (b) The commission is subject to Chapters 551 and 552,
- 8 Government Code.
- 9 Sec. 29.959. COMMISSION ABOLISHED; EXPIRATION OF
- 10 SUBCHAPTER. The commission is abolished and this subchapter
- 11 expires January 12, 2021.
- 12 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
