	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the duties of and training for certain officers and
- 3 jailers regarding the child safety check alert list.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Article 2.272, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Art. 2.272. [LAW ENFORCEMENT] RESPONSE TO CHILD SAFETY
- 8 CHECK ALERT. (a) If \underline{an} [\underline{a} peace] officer locates a child or other
- 9 person listed on the Texas Crime Information Center's child safety
- 10 check alert list established under Section 261.3022, Family Code,
- 11 the officer shall:
- 12 (1) immediately contact the Department of Family and
- 13 Protective Services on the department's dedicated law-enforcement
- 14 telephone number for statewide intake;
- 15 (2) request information from the department regarding
- 16 the circumstances of the case involving the child or other person;
- 17 and
- 18 (3) request information from the child and the other
- 19 person regarding the child's safety, well-being, and current
- 20 residence.
- 21 (b) The [peace] officer may temporarily detain the child or
- 22 other person to ensure the safety and well-being of the child.
- 23 (c) If the [peace] officer determines that the
- 24 circumstances described by Section 262.104, Family Code, exist, the

- 1 officer may take temporary possession of the child without a court
- 2 order as provided by Section 262.104, Family Code. If the [peace]
- 3 officer does not take temporary possession of the child, the
- 4 officer shall obtain the child's current address and any other
- 5 relevant information and report that information to the Department
- 6 of Family and Protective Services.
- 7 (d) An [A peace] officer who locates a child or other person
- 8 listed on the Texas Crime Information Center's child safety check
- alert list and who reports the child's or other person's current
- 10 address and other relevant information to the Department of Family
- 11 and Protective Services shall report to the Texas Crime Information
- 12 Center that the child or other person has been located and to whom
- 13 the child was released, as applicable.
- 14 (e) In this article, "officer" means:
- 15 <u>(1) a peace officer;</u>
- (2) a parole officer, as defined by Section 508.001,
- 17 Government Code;
- 18 <u>(3) a juvenile probation officer, juvenile</u>
- 19 supervision officer, juvenile correctional officer, or juvenile
- 20 parole officer;
- 21 (4) a supervision officer, as defined by Article
- 22 <u>42A.001; and</u>
- (5) a county jailer, as defined by Section 1701.001,
- 24 Occupations Code.
- 25 SECTION 2. Section 261.3023, Family Code, is amended to
- 26 read as follows:
- Sec. 261.3023. [LAW ENFORCEMENT] RESPONSE TO CHILD SAFETY

- 1 CHECK ALERT. If an [a law enforcement] officer, as defined by
- 2 Article 2.272, Code of Criminal Procedure, encounters a child or
- 3 other person listed on the Texas Crime Information Center's child
- 4 safety check alert list, the [law enforcement] officer shall follow
- 5 the procedures described by that article [Article 2.272, Code of
- 6 Criminal Procedure].
- 7 SECTION 3. Sections 261.3024(a) and (b), Family Code, are
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 (a) An [A law enforcement] officer, as defined by Article
- 10 2.272, Code of Criminal Procedure, who locates a child listed on the
- 11 Texas Crime Information Center's child safety check alert list
- 12 shall report that the child has been located in the manner
- 13 prescribed by that article [Article 2.272, Code of Criminal
- 14 Procedure].
- 15 (b) If the department locates a child who has been placed on
- 16 the child safety check alert list established under Section
- 17 261.3022 through a means other than information reported to the
- 18 department by an [a law enforcement] officer under Article 2.272,
- 19 Code of Criminal Procedure, the department shall report to the
- 20 Texas Crime Information Center that the child has been located.
- SECTION 4. Section 261.3025(b), Family Code, is amended to
- 22 read as follows:
- 23 (b) The report must include the following information for
- 24 the preceding calendar year:
- 25 (1) the number of peace [law enforcement] officers who
- 26 completed the training program established under Section 1701.266,
- 27 Occupations Code;

- 1 (2) the number of children who have been placed on the
- 2 child safety check alert list and the number of those children who
- 3 have been located; and
- 4 (3) the number of families who have been placed on the
- 5 child safety check alert list and the number of those families who
- 6 have been located.
- 7 SECTION 5. Section 76.005, Government Code, is amended by
- 8 adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:
- 9 (b-1) To be eligible for appointment as an officer who
- 10 supervises defendants placed on community supervision a person must
- 11 complete a training course on the Texas Crime Information Center's
- 12 child safety check alert list that is substantially similar to the
- 13 education and training program established under Section 1701.266,
- 14 Occupations Code.
- SECTION 6. Subchapter D, Chapter 508, Government Code, is
- 16 amended by adding Section 508.11411 to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 508.11411. SPECIALIZED TRAINING; CHILD SAFETY CHECK
- 18 ALERT LIST. The department shall develop and provide specialized
- 19 training for parole officers on the Texas Crime Information
- 20 Center's child safety check alert list. The training must be
- 21 substantially similar to the education and training program
- 22 established under Section 1701.266, Occupations Code.
- SECTION 7. Subchapter A, Chapter 221, Human Resources Code,
- 24 is amended by adding Section 221.0062 to read as follows:
- Sec. 221.0062. CHILD SAFETY CHECK ALERT LIST TRAINING. The
- 26 department shall provide training on the Texas Crime Information
- 27 Center's child safety check alert list during the preservice

- 1 training the department provides for juvenile probation officers,
- 2 juvenile supervision officers, juvenile correctional officers, and
- 3 juvenile parole officers. The training must be substantially
- 4 similar to the education and training program established under
- 5 Section 1701.266, Occupations Code.
- 6 SECTION 8. Section 1701.253, Occupations Code, is amended
- 7 by adding Subsection (p) to read as follows:
- 8 <u>(p) As part of the minimum curriculum requirements, the</u>
- 9 commission shall require an officer to complete the education and
- 10 training program on the Texas Crime Information Center's child
- 11 safety check alert list developed under Section 1701.266(a). An
- 12 officer shall complete the program not later than the second
- 13 anniversary of the date the officer is licensed under this chapter
- 14 unless the officer completes the program as part of the officer's
- 15 <u>basic training course.</u>
- SECTION 9. Section 1701.266, Occupations Code, is amended
- 17 by adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 18 (a-1) The commission by rule may require a county that
- 19 appoints or employs a county jailer to provide the jailer with
- 20 training that is substantially similar to the education and
- 21 training program established under this section.
- 22 SECTION 10. Not later than December 31, 2019, the Texas
- 23 Commission on Law Enforcement shall adopt the rules necessary to
- 24 implement Section 1701.253(p), Occupations Code, as added by this
- 25 Act, and Section 1701.266, Occupations Code, as amended by this
- 26 Act.
- 27 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
