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- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- SECTION 1. Chapter 509, Government Code, is amended by 5 adding Section 509.018 to read as follows: 6
- Sec. 509.018. FAMILY VIOLENCE PRETRIAL DIVERSION PILOT 7
- PROGRAM. (a) In this section, "family violence" has the meaning 8
- 9 assigned by Section 71.004, Family Code.
- (b) To reduce rates of family violence recidivism, the 10
- division shall collaborate with judges in Bexar County who have 11
- 12 jurisdiction over cases involving family violence to establish a
- family violence pretrial diversion pilot program for individuals 13
- 14 who are charged with an offense involving family violence and who
- suffer from a substance abuse disorder or chemical dependency. 15
- 16 (c) The pretrial diversion pilot program developed under
- this section shall include: 17
- 18 (1) assessment instruments to accurately analyze the
- needs of pilot program participants; 19
- (2) a comprehensive substance abuse disorder and 20
- chemical dependency treatment program that includes case managers, 21
- clinicians, peer mentors, or recovery coaches; 22
- 23 (3) in collaboration with law enforcement agencies, a
- procedure to rapidly respond to pilot program participants who fail 24

- 1 to comply with pilot program requirements, including, when
- 2 appropriate, immediate removal from the pilot program; and
- 3 (4) the use of a video teleconferencing system in
- 4 court to facilitate the cooperation of witnesses in the criminal
- 5 justice system and to reduce costs associated with transporting
- 6 defendants.
- 7 (d) The division shall review the pilot program established
- 8 under this section and submit a report to the governor, the
- 9 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives,
- 10 and the legislature not later than December 1 of each even-numbered
- 11 year. The report must include:
- 12 (1) a summary of the status and results of the pilot
- 13 program;
- 14 (2) an analysis of the effectiveness of the pilot
- 15 program in reducing the rate of family violence recidivism among
- 16 individuals charged with an offense involving family violence and
- 17 suffering from a substance abuse disorder or chemical dependency;
- 18 (3) sources of funding available to extend the pilot
- 19 program to other counties or for a longer period of time, including
- 20 available local, state, and federal funding sources; and
- 21 (4) any legislative or other recommendations.
- (e) This section expires September 1, 2023.
- 23 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
