- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 411, Government Code, is amended by 6 adding Subchapter Q to read as follows:
- 7 SUBCHAPTER Q. ALERT FOR MISSING ADULTS
- 8 Sec. 411.461. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- 9 (1) "Adult" means a person who is 18 years of age or 10 older.
- 11 (2) "Alert" means the countywide alert for missing
- 12 adults that is developed and implemented under this subchapter.
- 13 (3) "Serious bodily injury" has the meaning assigned
 14 by Section 1.07, Penal Code.
- Sec. 411.462. ALERT FOR MISSING ADULTS. With the
- 16 cooperation of the office of the governor and appropriate local law
- 17 enforcement agencies and state agencies, the department shall
- 18 develop and implement a system to allow a countywide alert to be
- 19 activated in a county on behalf of a missing adult.
- Sec. 411.463. ADMINISTRATION. (a) The director is the
- 21 statewide coordinator of the alert system.
- 22 (b) The director shall adopt rules and issue directives as
- 23 necessary to ensure proper implementation of the alert system. The
- 24 rules and directives must include:

- 1 (1) the procedures to be used by a local law
- 2 enforcement agency to verify whether an adult is:
- 3 (A) missing; and
- 4 (B) in imminent danger of serious bodily injury
- 5 or death;
- 6 (2) a description of the circumstances under which a
- 7 <u>local law enforcement agency is required to report a missing adult</u>
- 8 to the department; and
- 9 (3) the procedures to be used by an individual or
- 10 entity to report information about a missing adult to designated
- 11 media outlets in this state.
- 12 (c) The director shall prescribe forms for use by local law
- 13 enforcement agencies in requesting activation of the alert system
- 14 in a county.
- 15 Sec. 411.464. DEPARTMENT TO RECRUIT PARTICIPANTS. The
- 16 department shall recruit local television and radio broadcasters,
- 17 private commercial entities, state or local governmental entities,
- 18 the public, and other appropriate persons to assist in developing
- 19 and implementing the alert system.
- Sec. 411.465. STATE AGENCIES. A state agency participating
- 21 <u>in the alert system shall:</u>
- (1) cooperate with the department and assist in
- 23 developing and implementing the alert system; and
- 24 (2) establish a plan for providing relevant
- 25 information to applicable state officers, investigators, or
- 26 employees once the alert system has been activated.
- Sec. 411.466. NOTIFICATION TO DEPARTMENT OF MISSING ADULT.

- 1 (a) A local law enforcement agency with jurisdiction over the
- 2 matter shall notify the department if the agency:
- 3 (1) receives a report regarding a missing adult;
- 4 (2) verifies that at the time the adult is reported
- 5 missing:
- 6 (A) the person reported missing is 18 years of
- 7 age or older;
- 8 (B) the adult's location is unknown; and
- 9 (C) the adult has been missing for less than 72
- 10 hours;
- 11 (3) confirms that a preliminary investigation has
- 12 taken place with respect to the disappearance and that, as a result
- 13 of that investigation, the agency believes that the missing adult
- 14 is in imminent danger of serious bodily injury or death; and
- 15 (4) believes sufficient information is available to
- 16 disseminate to the public that could assist in locating the adult, a
- 17 person suspected of abducting the adult, or a vehicle suspected of
- 18 being used by the adult or in any abduction of the adult.
- 19 (b) The department may modify the criteria described by
- 20 Subsection (a) as necessary for the proper implementation of the
- 21 alert system.
- Sec. 411.467. ACTIVATION OF ALERT. (a) When a local law
- 23 enforcement agency notifies the department under Section 411.466,
- 24 the department shall confirm the accuracy of the information and,
- 25 if confirmed, immediately issue an alert under this subchapter in
- 26 accordance with the department's rules and directives under Section
- 27 411.463.

- 1 (b) The department may issue the alert on its own
- 2 initiative, without receiving the notification described by
- 3 Subsection (a), if:
- 4 (1) the issuance conforms to the department's rules
- 5 and directives; and
- 6 (2) the criteria described by Section 411.466(a) are
- 7 <u>satisfied</u>.
- 8 (c) In issuing the alert, the department shall send the
- 9 alert to designated media outlets in the county in which the adult
- 10 is missing. Following receipt of the alert, participating radio
- 11 stations and television stations and other participating media
- 12 outlets may issue the alert at designated intervals to assist in
- 13 locating the missing adult.
- 14 (d) The department shall also send the alert to:
- 15 (1) any appropriate local law enforcement agency; and
- 16 (2) a state agency described by Section 411.465.
- Sec. 411.468. CONTENT OF ALERT. The alert must include:
- 18 (1) all appropriate information that may lead to the
- 19 safe recovery of the missing adult, as determined by the
- 20 department; and
- 21 (2) a statement instructing any person with
- 22 <u>information related to the missing adult to contact a local or state</u>
- 23 <u>law enforcement agency.</u>
- Sec. 411.469. TERMINATION OF ALERT. (a) The director shall
- 25 terminate any activation of the alert with respect to a particular
- 26 missing adult not later than the earlier of the date on which:
- 27 (1) the missing adult is located or the situation is

- 1 <u>otherwise resolved; or</u>
- 2 (2) the notification period ends, as determined by
- 3 <u>department rule.</u>
- 4 (b) A local law enforcement agency that locates a missing
- 5 adult who is the subject of an alert under this subchapter shall
- 6 notify the department as soon as possible that the missing adult has
- 7 been located.
- 8 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
