- 1 (c) A [On the voluntary introduction into the body of any
  2 substance listed under Subsection (a)(2)(B), based on a] blood test
  3 or urinalysis of a specimen taken not later than four hours
  4 following an injury that shows the presence of a substance listed in
  5 Subsection (a)(2) creates [, it is] a rebuttable presumption that a
  6 person is intoxicated and does not have the normal use of mental or
  7 physical faculties.
- SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 9 to a claim for workers' compensation benefits based on a 10 compensable injury that occurs on or after the effective date of 11 this Act. A claim based on a compensable injury that occurs before 12 that date is governed by the law as it existed on the date the 13 compensable injury occurred, and the former law is continued in 14 effect for that purpose.
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
