## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the establishment of the Opioid and Substance Abuse 3 Advisory Council. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Subtitle E, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is 5 amended by adding Chapter 112 to read as follows: 6 CHAPTER 112. OPIOID AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE ADVISORY COUNCIL 7 Sec. 112.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: 8 (1) "Advisory council" means the Opioid and Substance 9 Abuse Advisory Council established under this chapter. 10 (2) "Commission" means the Health and Human Services 11 12 Commission. 13 Sec. 112.002. ESTABLISHMENT; PURPOSE. The commission shall 14 establish the Opioid and Substance Abuse Advisory Council to study and make recommendations to address opioid and substance abuse in 15 16 this state. Sec. 112.003. MEMBERS. (a) The advisory council is 17 composed of members appointed by the governor with the advice and 18 19 consent of the senate. 20 (b) The advisory council must include: 21 (1) a medical examiner; 22 (2) a pharmacist licensed in this state; 23 (3) a social worker who focuses on the issue of 24 substance abuse;

Sec. 112.004. TERMS; VACANCY. (a) Advisory council members 13 serve staggered four-year terms with half the members' terms 14 expiring February 1 of each odd-numbered year. 15 16 (b) A member may serve more than one term. 17 (c) If a vacancy occurs on the advisory council, a person shall be appointed to fill the vacancy for the unexpired term. 18 19 Sec. 112.005. OFFICERS; SUBCOMMITTEES. (a) Advisory council members shall: 20 21 (1) elect a chair and a vice chair; and (2) establish the <u>duties of the chair and the vice</u> 22 23 chair. 24 (b) The chair may appoint subcommittees. Sec. 112.006. MEETINGS. The advisory council shall meet at 25 26 least four times each year. Sec. 112.007. COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT. A member of 27

No. 3538 1 the advisory council may not receive compensation for service on the advisory council but is entitled to reimbursement of the travel 2 expenses incurred by the member while conducting the business of 3 the advisory council, as provided by the General Appropriations 4 5 Act. Sec. 112.008. DUTIES. The advisory council shall: 6 7 (1) serve as a central location for opioid and substance abuse information; 8 9 (2) maintain and provide the latest statistics and 10 information concerning research on opioid and substance abuse; (3) develop or recommend best practices for opioid and 11 12 substance abuse prevention and treatment, relevant training, and psychological and substance abuse treatments; and 13 14 (4) make policy recommendations related to opioid and 15 substance abuse prevention and treatment. 16 Sec. 112.009. REPORT. (a) Not later than January 1 of each 17 odd-numbered year, the advisory council shall provide a report to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the legislature, and the 18 19 commission. The report must include any findings 20 (b) and recommendations made by the advisory council regarding: 21 22 the advisory council's functions; 23 (2) strategic planning initiatives; and 24 (3) recommendations for proposed legislation. SECTION 2. (a) Not later than December 1, 2019, the 25 governor shall appoint the Opioid and Substance Abuse Advisory 26 Council members as required by Chapter 112, Health and Safety Code, 27

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1 as added by this Act.

2 (b) In making the initial appointments, the governor shall 3 designate half the members to a term expiring February 1, 2021, and 4 half the members to a term expiring February 1, 2023.

5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
