- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 27.001(2) and (6), Civil Practice and
- 6 Remedies Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (2) "Exercise of the right of association" means a
- 8 communication between individuals who join together to
- 9 collectively express, promote, pursue, or defend common interests.
- 10 The term does not include a communication that is the basis of a
- 11 claim asserting a misappropriation of a trade secret or a breach of
- 12 <u>a covenant not to compete.</u>
- 13 (6) "Legal action" means a lawsuit, cause of action,
- 14 petition, complaint, cross-claim, or counterclaim or any other
- 15 judicial pleading or filing that requests legal, [or] equitable, or
- 16 <u>declaratory</u> relief.
- 17 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 27.003, Civil Practice
- 18 and Remedies Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 27.003. MOTION TO DISMISS; RESPONSE.
- 20 SECTION 3. Section 27.003, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 21 Code, is amended by amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding
- 22 Subsections (d) and (e) to read as follows:
- 23 (a) Except as provided by this subsection, if [If] a legal
- 24 action is based on, relates to, or is in response to a party's

- 1 exercise of the right of free speech, right to petition, or right of
- 2 association, that party may file a motion to dismiss the legal
- 3 action. A party that is a governmental entity or governmental
- 4 official or employee acting in an official capacity may not file a
- 5 motion to dismiss under this subsection.
- 6 (b) A motion to dismiss a legal action under this section
- 7 must be filed not later than the 60th day after the date of service
- 8 of the legal action. The parties may agree to extend the time to
- 9 file a motion under this section, or the court may extend the time
- 10 to file a motion under this section on a showing of good cause.
- 11 (d) The moving party shall provide a nonmoving party written
- 12 notice of the date and time of the hearing on the motion to dismiss
- 13 not later than the 14th day before the date of the hearing unless
- 14 otherwise provided by an agreement of the parties or an order of the
- 15 court.
- 16 (e) A party responding to the motion to dismiss shall file
- 17 the response not later than the seventh day before the date of the
- 18 hearing on the motion to dismiss unless otherwise provided by an
- 19 agreement of the parties or an order of the court.
- SECTION 4. Sections 27.005(a) and (d), Civil Practice and
- 21 Remedies Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 22 (a) The court must rule on a motion under Section 27.003 not
- 23 later than the 30th day following the date on which [of] the hearing
- 24 on the motion concludes.
- 25 (d) Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection (c), the
- 26 court shall dismiss a legal action against the moving party if the
- 27 moving party establishes that the legal action fails as a matter of

- 1 law [by a preponderance of the evidence each essential element of a
- 2 valid defense to the nonmovant's claim].
- 3 SECTION 5. The heading to Section 27.006, Civil Practice
- 4 and Remedies Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 27.006. PROOF [EVIDENCE].
- 6 SECTION 6. Section 27.006(a), Civil Practice and Remedies
- 7 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) In determining whether a legal action should be
- 9 dismissed under this chapter, the court shall consider the
- 10 pleadings, admissible evidence submitted by the parties, and
- 11 supporting and opposing affidavits stating the facts on which the
- 12 liability or defense is based.
- SECTION 7. Chapter 27, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is
- 14 amended by adding Section 27.0075 to read as follows:
- Sec. 27.0075. EFFECT OF RULING. (a) A court's ruling on a
- 16 motion filed under Section 27.003 or the fact that the court made
- 17 the ruling is not admissible in evidence at any later stage of the
- 18 legal action.
- 19 (b) A court's ruling on a motion filed under Section 27.003
- 20 does not affect a party's applicable burden of proof.
- 21 SECTION 8. Section 27.009(a), Civil Practice and Remedies
- 22 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 23 (a) If the court orders dismissal of a legal action under
- 24 this chapter, the court [shall award to the moving party]:
- 25 (1) shall award to the moving party court costs $and[\tau]$
- 26 reasonable attorney's fees[, and other expenses] incurred in
- 27 defending against the legal action [as justice and equity may

- 1 require]; and
- 2 (2) may award to the moving party sanctions against
- 3 the party who brought the legal action as the court determines
- 4 sufficient to deter the party who brought the legal action from
- 5 bringing similar actions described in this chapter.
- 6 SECTION 9. The heading to Section 27.010, Civil Practice
- 7 and Remedies Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 27.010. APPLICABILITY OF CHAPTER [EXEMPTIONS].
- 9 SECTION 10. Section 27.010, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 10 Code, is amended by adding Subsections (c-1) and (e) to read as
- 11 follows:
- 12 <u>(c-1) Notwithstanding Subsections (b) and (c), this chapter</u>
- 13 applies to a legal action against a person based on the creation,
- 14 dissemination, exhibition, advertisement, or other similar
- 15 promotion of a dramatic, literary, musical, political, or other
- 16 artistic work, including a motion picture or television program, or
- 17 an article published in a newspaper or magazine of general
- 18 circulation.
- (e) This chapter does not apply to an action filed under
- 20 Title 1, 2, 4, or 5, Family Code, or an application for a protective
- 21 order under Chapter 7A, Code of Criminal Procedure.
- 22 SECTION 11. Section 27.011, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 23 Code, is amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- (c) This chapter does not limit or preclude the enforcement
- 25 by a legislative or executive body or a public agency of the rules
- 26 of procedure and rules of order of the body or agency.
- 27 SECTION 12. Section 27.007, Civil Practice and Remedies

- 1 Code, is repealed.
- 2 SECTION 13. Chapter 27, Civil Practice and Remedies Code,
- 3 as amended by this Act, applies only to an action filed on or after
- 4 the effective date of this Act. An action filed before the
- 5 effective date of this Act is governed by the law applicable to the
- 6 action immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that
- 7 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 8 SECTION 14. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
