## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the expansion of eligibility for Medicaid to certain
- 3 persons who are younger than 26 years of age.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
- 6 is amended by adding Section 32.02472 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 32.02472. EXPANDED ELIGIBILITY FOR MEDICAL
- 8 ASSISTANCE. (a) Notwithstanding any other law, the commission
- 9 shall provide medical assistance to all persons younger than 26
- 10 years of age who apply for that assistance and for whom federal
- 11 matching funds are available.
- 12 (b) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules necessary
- 13 to implement this section.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 32.02472, Human Resources Code, as added
- 15 by this Act, applies only to an initial determination or
- 16 recertification of eligibility of a person for medical assistance
- 17 under Chapter 32, Human Resources Code, made on or after the date
- 18 the section is implemented, regardless of the date the person
- 19 applied for that assistance.
- 20 SECTION 3. As soon as possible after the effective date of
- 21 this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 22 Services Commission shall take all necessary actions to expand
- 23 eligibility for medical assistance under Chapter 32, Humar
- 24 Resources Code, in accordance with Section 32.02472, Human

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- 1 Resources Code, as added by this Act, including notifying
- 2 appropriate federal agencies of that expanded eligibility.
- 3 SECTION 4. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 4 a state agency determines that any other waiver or authorization
- 5 from a federal agency is necessary for implementation of that
- 6 provision, the agency affected by the provision shall request the
- 7 waiver or authorization and may delay implementing that provision
- 8 until the waiver or authorization is granted.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
