A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to compensation received by state employees working in
- 3 certain high injury risk positions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 57.48(k)(1), Education Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (1) "Compensation" means base salary or wages,
- 8 longevity pay, high injury risk [hazardous duty] pay, benefit
- 9 replacement pay, or an emolument provided in lieu of base salary or
- 10 wages.
- SECTION 2. Section 403.055(1)(1), Government Code, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 (1) "Compensation" means base salary or wages,
- 14 longevity pay, high injury risk [hazardous duty] pay, benefit
- 15 replacement pay, or an emolument provided in lieu of base salary or
- 16 wages.
- SECTION 3. Section 659.044(e), Government Code, is amended
- 18 to read as follows:
- 19 (e) This subsection applies only to an employee of the Texas
- 20 Juvenile Justice Department who is receiving less than the maximum
- 21 amount of high injury risk [hazardous duty] pay that the department
- 22 may pay to the employee under Section 659.303. The employee's
- 23 monthly amount of longevity pay is the sum of:
- 24 (1) \$4 for each year of lifetime service credit, which

- 1 may not include any period served in a high injury risk [hazardous
- 2 duty] position; and
- 3 (2) the lesser of:
- 4 (A) \$4 for each year served in a high injury risk
- 5 [hazardous duty] position; or
- 6 (B) the difference between:
- 7 (i) \$7 for each year served in a <u>high injury</u>
- 8 risk [hazardous duty] position; and
- 9 (ii) the amount paid by the department for
- 10 each year served in a high injury risk [hazardous duty] position.
- SECTION 4. Section 659.046(f), Government Code, is amended
- 12 to read as follows:
- 13 (f) The amount of an employee's lifetime service credit does
- 14 not include the period served in a high injury risk [hazardous duty]
- 15 position if the employee is:
- 16 (1) entitled to receive <u>high injury risk</u> [hazardous
- 17 duty] pay under Section 659.302; or
- 18 (2) receiving the maximum amount of high injury risk
- 19 [hazardous duty] pay that the Texas Juvenile Justice Department may
- 20 pay to the employee under Section 659.303.
- SECTION 5. Section 659.124(c), Government Code, is amended
- 22 to read as follows:
- 23 (c) In this section, "compensation" means annualized base
- 24 salary or wages, including longevity and high injury risk
- 25 [hazardous duty] pay.
- SECTION 6. The heading to Subchapter L, Chapter 659,
- 27 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

- 1 SUBCHAPTER L. <u>HIGH INJURY RISK</u> [HAZARDOUS DUTY] PAY
- 2 SECTION 7. Sections 659.301(2) and (5), Government Code,
- 3 are amended to read as follows:
- 4 (2) "High injury risk [Hazardous duty] position" means
- 5 a position in the service of this state that:
- 6 (A) renders any individual holding that position
- 7 a state employee; or
- 8 (B) requires the performance of <u>a high injury</u>
- 9 risk [hazardous] duty.
- 10 (5) "State employee" means an individual who:
- 11 (A) is a commissioned law enforcement officer of
- 12 the Department of Public Safety, the Texas Facilities Commission,
- 13 the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission, the Texas Department of
- 14 Criminal Justice, or the attorney general;
- 15 (B) is a commissioned security officer of the
- 16 comptroller;
- 17 (C) is a law enforcement officer commissioned by
- 18 the Parks and Wildlife Commission;
- 19 (D) is a commissioned peace officer of an
- 20 institution of higher education;
- 21 (E) is an employee or official of the Board of
- 22 Pardons and Paroles or the parole division of the Texas Department
- 23 of Criminal Justice if the employee or official has routine direct
- 24 contact with inmates of any penal or correctional institution or
- 25 with administratively released prisoners subject to the board's
- 26 jurisdiction;
- 27 (F) has been certified to the Employees

- 1 Retirement System of Texas under Section 815.505 as having begun
- 2 employment as a law enforcement officer or custodial officer,
- 3 unless the individual has been certified to the system as having
- 4 ceased employment as a law enforcement officer or custodial
- 5 officer; [or]
- 6 (G) before May 29, 1987, received high injury
- 7 <u>risk</u> [hazardous duty] pay based on the terms of any state law if the
- 8 individual holds a position designated under that law as eligible
- 9 for the pay; or
- 10 (H) is an employee of a state supported living
- 11 center as defined by Section 531.002, Health and Safety Code, or a
- 12 state hospital if the employee is in direct contact with patients
- 13 for more than 50 percent of the employee's time working in the
- 14 facility.
- SECTION 8. The heading to Section 659.302, Government Code,
- 16 is amended to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 659.302. ENTITLEMENT TO RECEIVE HIGH INJURY RISK
- 18 [HAZARDOUS DUTY] PAY.
- 19 SECTION 9. Section 659.302(a), Government Code, is amended
- 20 to read as follows:
- 21 (a) <u>High injury risk</u> [Hazardous duty] pay is included in the
- 22 compensation paid to an individual for services rendered during a
- 23 month if the individual:
- 24 (1) is a state employee for any portion of the first
- 25 workday of the month; and
- 26 (2) has completed at least 12 months of lifetime
- 27 service credit not later than the last day of the preceding month.

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- 1 SECTION 10. Sections 659.303(a) and (d), Government Code,
- 2 are amended to read as follows:
- 3 (a) The department may include <u>high injury risk</u> [hazardous
- 4 duty pay in the compensation paid to an individual for services
- 5 rendered during a month if the individual:
- 6 (1) has routine direct contact with youth:
- 7 (A) placed in a residential facility of the
- 8 department; or
- 9 (B) released under the department's supervision;
- 10 and
- 11 (2) has completed at least 12 months of lifetime
- 12 service credit not later than the last day of the preceding month.
- 13 (d) The department may not pay high injury risk [hazardous
- 14 duty] pay:
- 15 (1) from funds authorized for payment of an
- 16 across-the-board employee salary increase; or
- 17 (2) to an employee who works at the department's
- 18 central office.
- 19 SECTION 11. Section 659.304, Government Code, is amended to
- 20 read as follows:
- Sec. 659.304. INELIGIBILITY TO RECEIVE <u>HIGH INJURY RISK</u>
- 22 [HAZARDOUS DUTY] PAY. High injury risk [Hazardous duty] pay may be
- 23 paid only to an individual who is:
- 24 (1) entitled to receive the pay under Section 659.302;
- 25 or
- 26 (2) eligible to receive the pay under Section 659.303.
- 27 SECTION 12. The heading to Section 659.305, Government

- 1 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 659.305. AMOUNT OF HIGH INJURY RISK [HAZARDOUS DUTY]
- 3 PAY.
- 4 SECTION 13. Sections 659.305(a), (b), (f), and (h),
- 5 Government Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) Except as provided by Subsections (b) and (h), the
- 7 amount of a full-time state employee's high injury risk [hazardous
- 8 duty pay for a particular month is \$10 for each 12-month period of
- 9 lifetime service credit accrued by the employee.
- 10 (b) This subsection applies only to a state employee whose
- 11 compensation for services provided to the state during any month
- 12 before August 1987 included high injury risk [hazardous duty] pay
- 13 that was based on total state service performed before May 29, 1987.
- 14 The amount of a full-time state employee's <u>high injury risk</u>
- 15 [hazardous duty] pay for a particular month is the sum of:
- 16 (1) \$10 for each 12-month period of state service
- 17 credit the employee finished accruing before May 29, 1987; and
- 18 (2) \$10 for each 12-month period of lifetime service
- 19 credit that the employee accrued after the date, which must be
- 20 before May 29, 1987, on which the employee finished accruing the
- 21 last 12-month period of state service credit.
- 22 (f) The amount of a part-time state employee's <u>high injury</u>
- $23 \text{ } \underline{\text{risk}} \text{ } [\frac{\text{hazardous duty}}{\text{duty}}]$ pay is proportional to the amount of a
- 24 full-time state employee's pay under Subsection (a), (b), or (h).
- 25 (h) The amount of high injury risk [hazardous duty] pay for
- 26 a particular month for a full-time correctional officer employed by
- 27 the Texas Department of Criminal Justice is the lesser of:

- 1 (1) \$12 for each 12-month period of lifetime service
- 2 credit accrued by the employee; or
- 3 (2) \$300.
- 4 SECTION 14. Section 659.306, Government Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 659.306. RESPONSIBILITY FOR PAYING HIGH INJURY RISK
- 7 [HAZARDOUS DUTY] PAY. The state agency that employs an individual
- 8 at the beginning of the first workday of a month must pay any high
- 9 injury risk [hazardous duty] pay that is included in the
- 10 compensation paid to the individual for services rendered during
- 11 that month. If the individual transfers to a second state agency
- 12 during that month, the first agency remains responsible for paying
- 13 the full amount of high injury risk [hazardous duty] pay for that
- 14 month.
- 15 SECTION 15. Section 659.307, Government Code, is amended to
- 16 read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 659.307. SERVICE CREDIT. (a) The amount of an
- 18 individual's lifetime service credit equals the number of months
- 19 the individual has served in a <u>high injury risk</u> [hazardous duty]
- 20 position during the individual's lifetime.
- 21 (b) The amount of an individual's state service credit
- 22 equals the sum of:
- 23 (1) the amount of the individual's lifetime service
- 24 credit, as determined under Subsection (a); and
- 25 (2) the number of months during the individual's
- 26 lifetime that the individual has provided services to the state in a
- 27 position that is not a high injury risk [hazardous duty] position.

- 1 SECTION 16. Section 661.034(b), Government Code, is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 (b) Under this section, rate of compensation:
- 4 (1) includes an emolument in lieu of base pay for which
- 5 the state employee was eligible on the last day of employment; and
- 6 (2) does not include longevity or <u>high injury risk</u>
- 7 [hazardous duty] pay.
- 8 SECTION 17. Section 661.063(c), Government Code, is amended
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 (c) Under this section, rate of compensation:
- 11 (1) includes an emolument in lieu of base pay for which
- 12 the state employee was eligible; and
- 13 (2) does not include longevity or <u>high injury risk</u>
- 14 [hazardous duty] pay.
- SECTION 18. Section 661.067(b), Government Code, is amended
- 16 to read as follows:
- 17 (b) A state employee who remains on the payroll of a state
- 18 agency under this section:
- 19 (1) is entitled to continue to receive all
- 20 compensation and benefits that the state employee was receiving on
- 21 the employee's last day of duty, including paid holidays, longevity
- 22 pay, and high injury risk [hazardous duty] pay;
- 23 (2) is entitled to a general salary increase for state
- 24 employees that takes effect before the employee's accrued vacation
- 25 time is exhausted; and
- 26 (3) may not use sick leave or accrue sick leave or
- 27 vacation time.

          SECTION 20. Section 811.001(7), Government Code, is amended
15
    to read as follows:
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16 (7) "Compensation" means the base salary of a person; 17 amounts that would otherwise qualify as compensation but are not received directly by a person pursuant to a good faith, voluntary, 18 19 written salary reduction agreement in order to finance payments to a deferred compensation or tax 20 sheltered annuity program specifically authorized by state law or to finance benefit options 21 under a cafeteria plan qualifying under Section 125 of the Internal 22 Revenue Code of 1986 (26 U.S.C. Section 125); longevity and high 23 24 injury risk [hazardous duty] pay; nonmonetary compensation, the value of which is determined by the retirement system; amounts by 25 26 which a person's salary is reduced under a salary reduction agreement authorized by Chapter 610; and the benefit replacement 27

- 1 pay a person earns under Subchapter H, Chapter 659, [as added by
- 2 Chapter 417, Acts of the 74th Legislature, 1995, except for the
- 3 benefit replacement pay a person earns as a result of a payment made
- 4 under Subchapter B, C, or D, Chapter 661. The term excludes
- 5 overtime pay and a cleaning or clothing allowance.
- 6 SECTION 21. Section 814.203(c), Government Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (c) For the purposes of this section, "comparable pay" means
- 9 80 percent or more of the member's final state employment base pay
- 10 before deductions for taxes or deferred compensation under state
- 11 and federal law, including any longevity or https://doi.org/10.1016/journal.com/
- 12 [hazardous duty] pay, but excluding the monetary value of any
- 13 insurance or retirement benefits. Comparable pay may be adjusted
- 14 by the retirement system to account for adjustments in state pay
- 15 rates.
- 16 SECTION 22. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
