- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 61.0521 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 61.0521. RECOGNITION OF COMPETENCY-BASED EDUCATION
- 9 DEGREE PLANS FOR MEMBERS OF TEXAS MILITARY FORCES. (a) In this
- 10 section, "Texas military forces" has the meaning assigned by
- 11 Section 437.001, Government Code.
- 12 (b) The board may approve an institution of higher education
- 13 recognized by the board to offer a degree in coordination with the
- 14 Texas Military Department that uses alternative methods of
- 15 <u>determining mastery of program content</u>, including competency-based
- 16 education.
- 17 <u>(c) To be eligible for a degree approved under this section,</u>
- 18 a person must:
- 19 (1) have graduated from high school or received the
- 20 equivalent of a high school diploma;
- 21 (2) satisfy the minimum active military service
- 22 obligation to the Texas military forces for a degree plan as
- 23 follows:
- 24 (A) for an associate degree, two years of

- 1 service;
- 2 <u>(B) for a baccalaureate degree, four years of</u>
- 3 service; and
- 4 (C) for a graduate degree, six years of service;
- 5 <u>and</u>
- 6 (3) complete and meet the standards of the degree
- 7 plan.
- 8 <u>(d) The board may propose rules to establish requirements</u>
- 9 under which a person's training and experience acquired during the
- 10 person's military service serve as proof of the person's
- 11 demonstration of subject matter knowledge if that training and
- 12 experience are verified by the Texas Military Department.
- 13 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with degree plans
- 14 offered for enrollment for the 2020-2021 academic year.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
