## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to eliminating certain state-required end-of-course

- 3 assessment instruments not required by federal law.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 39.023, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (c) and (c-3) and adding Subsection (q) to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (c) The agency shall also adopt end-of-course assessment
- 9 instruments for secondary-level courses in Algebra I, biology, and
- 10 English I[, English II, and United States history]. The Algebra I
- 11 end-of-course assessment instrument must be administered with the
- 12 aid of technology. The English I [and English II] end-of-course
- 13 assessment <u>instrument</u> [<u>instruments</u>] must [<u>each</u>] assess essential
- 14 knowledge and skills in both reading and writing in the same
- 15 assessment instrument and must provide a single score. A school
- 16 district shall comply with State Board of Education rules regarding
- 17 administration of the assessment instruments listed in this
- 18 subsection. If a student is in a special education program under
- 19 Subchapter A, Chapter 29, the student's admission, review, and
- 20 dismissal committee shall determine whether any allowable
- 21 modification is necessary in administering to the student an
- 22 assessment instrument required under this subsection. The State
- 23 Board of Education shall administer the assessment instruments.
- 24 The State Board of Education shall adopt a schedule for the

- 1 administration of end-of-course assessment instruments that
- 2 complies with the requirements of Subsection (c-3).
- 3 (c-3) In adopting a schedule for the administration of
- 4 assessment instruments under this section, the State Board of
- 5 Education shall require:
- 6 (1) assessment instruments administered under
- 7 Subsection (a) to be administered on a schedule so that the first
- 8 assessment instrument is administered at least two weeks later than
- 9 the date on which the first assessment instrument was administered
- 10 under Subsection (a) during the 2006-2007 school year; and
- 11 (2) the spring administration of end-of-course
- 12 assessment instruments under Subsection (c) to occur in each school
- 13 district not earlier than the first full week in May, except that
- 14 the spring administration of the end-of-course assessment
- 15 <u>instrument</u> [instruments] in English I [and English II] must be
- 16 permitted to occur at an earlier date.
- 17 (q) This subsection applies to end-of-course assessment
- 18 instruments adopted under Subsection (c) for secondary-level
- 19 courses in English II and United States history, as that subsection
- 20 existed before amendment by \_\_.B. No.\_\_\_, Acts of the 86th
- 21 Legislature, Regular Session, 2019. The agency may retain
- 22 assessment instruments described by this subsection, but may not
- 23 require a school district to administer those assessment
- 24 instruments. A school district may choose to administer an
- 25 assessment instrument described by this subsection. An assessment
- 26 instrument described by this subsection administered by a school
- 27 district may not be used for accountability purposes to measure the

- 1 performance of the district or a district campus.
- 2 SECTION 2. Section 39.025(a-1), Education Code, is amended
- 3 to read as follows:

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- 4 student enrolled in a college preparatory 5 mathematics or English language arts course under Section 28.014 who satisfies the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) college readiness 6 benchmarks prescribed by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating 7 8 Board under Section 51.334 on an assessment instrument designated by the coordinating board under that section administered at the 9 10 end of the college preparatory mathematics or English language arts 11 course satisfies the requirements concerning and is exempt from the administration of the Algebra I or the English I [and English II] 12 end-of-course assessment instrument [instruments], as applicable, 13 as prescribed by Section 39.023(c), even if the student did not 14 15 perform satisfactorily on a previous administration of applicable end-of-course assessment instrument. A student who 16 17 fails to perform satisfactorily on the assessment instrument designated by the coordinating board under Section 51.334 18 administered as provided by this subsection may retake that 19 assessment instrument for purposes of this subsection or may take 20
- 22 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2019-2020 23 school year.

the appropriate end-of-course assessment instrument.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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1 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
