A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the assignment of performance ratings under the public school accountability system. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Sections 39.054(a), (a-1), (a-2), and Education Code, are amended to read as follows: 6 7 (a) The commissioner shall adopt rules to evaluate school district and campus performance and assign each district and campus an overall performance rating and [of A, B, C, D, or F. In addition to the overall performance rating, the commissioner shall assign

8 9 10 each district and campus] a separate domain performance rating [of 11 A, B, C, D, or F] for each domain under Section 39.053(c)[. An 12 overall or domain performance rating] of [A reflects] exemplary 13 performance, [. An overall or domain performance rating of B 14 reflects] recognized performance,[. An overall or domain 15 16 performance rating of C reflects] acceptable performance, [. An overall or domain performance rating of D reflects] performance 17 that needs improvement, [. An overall] or [domain performance rating 18 of F reflects] unacceptable performance. A district may not receive 19 20 an overall or domain performance rating of exemplary performance 21 [A] if the district includes any campus with a corresponding overall or domain performance rating of performance that needs 22 23  $\underline{\text{improvement or unacceptable performance}}$  [D or F]. If a school

district has been approved under Section 39.0544 to assign campus

- 1 performance ratings and the commissioner has not assigned a campus
- 2 an overall performance rating of <u>performance that needs improvement</u>
- 3 or unacceptable performance  $[\frac{D \text{ or } F}{}]$ , the commissioner shall assign
- 4 the campus an overall performance rating based on the school
- 5 district assigned performance rating under Section 39.0544. A
- 6 reference in law to an acceptable rating or acceptable performance
- 7 includes an overall or domain performance rating of [A, B, C, or D
- 8 or performance that is exemplary, recognized, or acceptable
- 9 performance or performance that needs improvement.
- 10 (a-1) For purposes of assigning an overall performance
- 11 rating for a district or campus under Subsection (a), the
- 12 commissioner shall:
- 13 (1) consider either the district's or campus's
- 14 performance rating under the student achievement domain under
- 15 Section 39.053(c)(1) or the school progress domain under Section
- 16 39.053(c)(2), whichever performance rating is higher, unless the
- 17 district or campus received a performance rating of unacceptable
- 18  $\underline{\text{performance}}$  [ $\underline{\textbf{F}}$ ] in either domain, in which case the district or
- 19 campus may not be assigned a performance rating higher than
- 20 recognized performance [a-B] for the composite for the two domains;
- 21 and
- 22 (2) attribute not less than 30 percent of the
- 23 performance rating to the closing the gaps domain under Section
- 24 39.053(c)(3).
- 25 (a-2) The commissioner by rule may adopt procedures to
- 26 ensure that a repeated performance rating of performance that needs
- 27 improvement  $[D ext{ or } F]$  or unacceptable performance in one domain,

- 1 particularly performance that is not significantly improving, is
- 2 reflected in the overall performance rating of a district or campus
- 3 under this section or a campus under Section 39.0544 and is not
- 4 compensated for by a performance rating of exemplary, recognized,
- 5 or acceptable performance [A, B, or C] in another domain.
- 6 (b) For purposes of assigning school districts and campuses
- 7 an overall and a domain performance rating under Subsection (a),
- 8 the commissioner shall ensure that the method used to evaluate
- 9 performance is implemented in a manner that provides the
- 10 mathematical possibility that all districts and campuses receive an
- 11 <u>exemplary performance</u> [A] rating.
- 12 SECTION 2. Sections 39.0544(a) and (e), Education Code, are
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) The commissioner shall adopt rules regarding the
- 15 assignment of campus performance ratings by school districts and
- 16 open-enrollment charter schools. The rules:
- 17 (1) must require a district or school, in assigning an
- 18 overall performance rating for a campus, to incorporate:
- 19 (A) domain performance ratings assigned by the
- 20 commissioner under Section 39.054; and
- 21 (B) performance ratings based on locally
- 22 developed domains or sets of accountability measures;
- 23 (2) may permit a district or school to assign weights
- 24 to each domain or set of accountability measures described in
- 25 Subdivision (1), as determined by the district or school, provided
- 26 that the domains specified in Subdivision (1)(A) must in the
- 27 aggregate account for at least 50 percent of the overall

- 1 performance rating;
- 2 (3) must require that each locally developed domain or
- 3 set of accountability measures:
- 4 (A) contains levels of performance that allow for
- 5 differentiation, with assigned standards for achieving the
- 6 differentiated levels;
- 7 (B) provides for the assignment of a performance
- 8 rating of exemplary performance, recognized performance,
- 9 acceptable performance, performance that needs improvement, or
- 10 <u>unacceptable performance</u> [<del>letter grade of A, B, C, D, or F</del>]; and
- 11 (C) meets standards for reliability and
- 12 validity;
- 13 (4) must require that calculations for overall
- 14 performance ratings and each locally developed domain or set of
- 15 accountability measures be capable of being audited by a third
- 16 party;
- 17 (5) must require that a district or school produce a
- 18 campus score card that may be displayed on the agency's website; and
- 19 (6) must require that a district or school develop and
- 20 make available to the public an explanation of the methodology used
- 21 to assign performance ratings under this section.
- 22 (e) A school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 23 authorized under this section to assign campus performance ratings
- 24 shall evaluate the performance of each campus as provided by this
- 25 section and assign each campus a performance rating of exemplary
- 26 performance, recognized performance, acceptable performance,
- 27 performance that needs improvement, or unacceptable performance

- 1 [A, B, C, D, or F] for overall performance and for each locally
- 2 developed domain or set of accountability measures. Not later than
- 3 a date established by the commissioner, the district or school
- 4 shall:
- 5 (1) report the performance ratings to the agency; and
- 6 (2) make the performance ratings available to the
- 7 public as provided by commissioner rule.
- 8 SECTION 3. Section 39.101, Education Code, as added by
- 9 Chapter 807 (H.B. 22), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
- 10 Session, 2017, is transferred to Subchapter B, Chapter 39A,
- 11 Education Code, redesignated as Section 39A.0545, Education Code,
- 12 amended to conform to the repeal of Subchapter E, Chapter 39,
- 13 Education Code, by Article 21, Chapter 324 (S.B. 1488), Acts of the
- 14 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017, and further amended to
- 15 read as follows:

- 17 RATING. (a) Notwithstanding any other law, if a school district or
- 18 campus is assigned an overall or domain performance rating of
- 19 performance that needs improvement  $[\frac{1}{2}]$ :
- 20 (1) the commissioner shall order the district or
- 21 campus to develop and implement a targeted improvement plan
- 22 approved by the board of trustees of the district; and
- 23 (2) the interventions and sanctions provided by this
- 24 chapter [subchapter] based on failure to satisfy performance
- 25 standards under Section 39.054(e) apply to the district or campus
- 26 only as provided by this section.
- 27 (b) The interventions and sanctions provided by this

- 1 <u>chapter</u> [<del>subchapter</del>] based on failure to satisfy performance
- 2 standards under Section 39.054(e) apply to a district or campus
- 3 ordered to develop and implement a targeted improvement plan under
- 4 Subsection (a) only if the district or campus is assigned:
- 5 (1) an overall or domain performance rating of
- 6 unacceptable performance [F]; or
- 7 (2) an overall performance rating of performance that
- 8 needs improvement [P] as provided by Subsection (c).
- 9 (c) If a school district or campus is assigned an overall
- 10 performance rating of performance that needs improvement  $[\frac{1}{2}]$  for a
- 11 school year after the district or campus is ordered to develop and
- 12 implement a targeted improvement plan under Subsection (a), the
- 13 commissioner shall implement interventions and sanctions that
- 14 apply to an unacceptable campus and those interventions and
- 15 sanctions shall continue for each consecutive school year
- 16 thereafter in which the campus is assigned an overall performance
- 17 rating of performance that needs improvement  $[\frac{1}{2}]$ .
- 18 (d) The commissioner shall adopt rules as necessary to
- 19 implement this section.
- SECTION 4. Section 42.005(k), Education Code, is amended to
- 21 read as follows:
- 22 (k) A charter school operating under a charter granted under
- 23 Chapter 12 before January 1, 2015, is eligible to earn full average
- 24 daily attendance under Subsection (a), as that subsection existed
- 25 immediately before January 1, 2015, for:
- 26 (1) all campuses of the charter school operating
- 27 before January 1, 2015; and

- 1 (2) any campus or site expansion approved on or after
- 2 January 1, 2015, provided that the charter school received an
- 3 academic accountability performance rating of acceptable
- 4 performance [C] or higher, and the campus or site expansion is
- 5 approved by the commissioner.
- 6 SECTION 5. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails
- 7 over another Act of the 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019,
- 8 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted
- 9 codes.
- SECTION 6. This Act applies beginning with the 2019-2020
- 11 school year.
- 12 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
