- 9 order, or permanent injunction in a proceeding brought under
- 10 Subsection (a) of this section, the consumer protection division
- 11 may request, and the trier of fact may award, a civil penalty to be

- 13 (1) not more than \$10,000 [\$20,000] per violation; and
- 14 (2) if the act or practice that is the subject of the
- 15 proceeding was calculated to acquire or deprive money or other
- 16 property from a consumer who was 65 years of age or older when the
- 17 act or practice occurred, an additional amount of not more than
- 18 \$250,000.
- 19 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply to an
- 20 action filed by the consumer protection division under Section
- 21 17.47, Business and Commerce Code, on or after the effective date of
- 22 this Act. A action filed action filed by the consumer protection
- 23 division under Section 17.47, Business and Commerce Code, before
- 24 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on

- 1 the date the action is filed, and the former law is continued in
- 2 effect for that purpose.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
