- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Sections 411.199(a), (b), and (c), Government
- 7 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) The following peace officers may apply for a license
- 9 <u>issued under this subchapter at any time after retirement:</u>
- 10 $\underline{\text{(1)}}$ a $\underline{\text{[A]}}$ person who is licensed as a peace officer
- 11 under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, and who has been employed
- 12 full-time as a peace officer by a law enforcement agency;
- 13 (2) a railroad peace officer appointed by the director
- 14 under Article 2.121, Code of Criminal Procedure, who holds a
- 15 certificate of authority issued by the director under that article
- 16 and a peace officer license issued by the Texas Commission on Law
- 17 Enforcement; or
- 18 (3) a special ranger of the Texas and Southwestern
- 19 Cattle Raisers Association appointed by the director under Article
- 20 2.125, Code of Criminal Procedure, who holds a certificate of
- 21 <u>authority</u> issued by the director under that article and a peace
- 22 officer license issued by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement
- 23 [may apply for a license under this subchapter at any time after
- 24 retirement].

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- 1 (b) The person shall submit two complete sets of legible and 2 classifiable fingerprints and a sworn statement from the head of 3 the law enforcement agency that employed [employing] the applicant 4 or other former employer of the applicant, as applicable. A head of 5 a law enforcement agency or other former employer may not refuse to 6 issue a statement under this subsection. If the applicant alleges 7 that the statement is untrue, the department shall investigate the
- 9 (1) the name and rank of the applicant;
- 10 (2) the status of the applicant before retirement;

validity of the statement. The statement must include:

- 11 (3) whether [or not] the applicant was accused of
- 12 misconduct at the time of the retirement;
- 13 (4) the physical and mental condition of the 14 applicant;
- 15 (5) the type of weapons the applicant had demonstrated
- 16 proficiency with during the last year of employment;
- 17 (6) whether the applicant would be eligible for
- 18 reemployment with the agency or employer, and if not, the reasons
- 19 the applicant is not eligible; and
- 20 (7) a recommendation from the agency head <u>or the</u>
- 21 <u>employer</u> regarding the issuance of a license under this subchapter.
- (c) The department may issue a license <u>issued</u> under this
- 23 subchapter to an applicant under this section if the applicant is
- 24 honorably retired and physically and emotionally fit to possess a
- 25 handgun. In this subsection, "honorably retired" means the
- 26 applicant:

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27 (1) did not retire in lieu of any disciplinary action;

- 1 (2) was eligible to retire from the law enforcement
- 2 agency or other former employer or was ineligible to retire only as
- 3 a result of an injury received in the course of the applicant's
- 4 employment [with the agency]; and
- 5 (3) for a peace officer described by Subsection
- 6 (a)(1), is entitled to receive a pension or annuity for service as a
- 7 law enforcement officer or is not entitled to receive a pension or
- 8 annuity only because the law enforcement agency that employed the
- 9 applicant does not offer a pension or annuity to its employees.
- 10 SECTION 2. Sections 411.1991(a), (a-1), and (b-1),
- 11 Government Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 12 (a) A person may apply for a license issued under this
- 13 subchapter if the person [who] is:
- 14 (1) licensed as a peace officer under Chapter 1701,
- 15 Occupations Code, and employed as a peace officer by a law
- 16 enforcement agency;
- 17 (2) a railroad peace officer appointed by the director
- 18 under Article 2.121, Code of Criminal Procedure, who holds a
- 19 certificate of authority issued by the director under that article
- 20 and a peace officer license issued by the Texas Commission on Law
- 21 Enforcement;
- 22 (3) a special ranger of the Texas and Southwestern
- 23 Cattle Raisers Association appointed by the director under Article
- 24 2.125, Code of Criminal Procedure, who holds a certificate of
- 25 authority issued by the director under that article and a peace
- 26 officer license issued by the Texas Commission on Law
- 27 Enforcement; $[\tau]$ or

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- 1 (4) [who is] a member of the Texas military forces,
- 2 excluding Texas State Guard members who are serving in the Texas
- 3 Legislature[, may apply for a license under this subchapter].
- 4 (a-1) An applicant who is a peace officer described by
- 5 Subsection (a)(1), (2), or (3) shall submit to the department:
- 6 (1) the name and rank of the applicant; and
- 7 (2) a current copy of the applicant's [peace officer]
- 8 license issued by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement and
- 9 evidence of employment as a peace officer, railroad peace officer,
- 10 or special ranger, as applicable.
- 11 (b-1) An applicant under this section who is a peace officer
- 12 described by Subsection (a)(1), (2), or (3) and who complies with
- 13 Subsection (a-1) and the other requirements of this subchapter is
- 14 not required to complete the handgun proficiency course described
- 15 by Section 411.188 to obtain a license <u>issued</u> under this
- 16 subchapter.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
